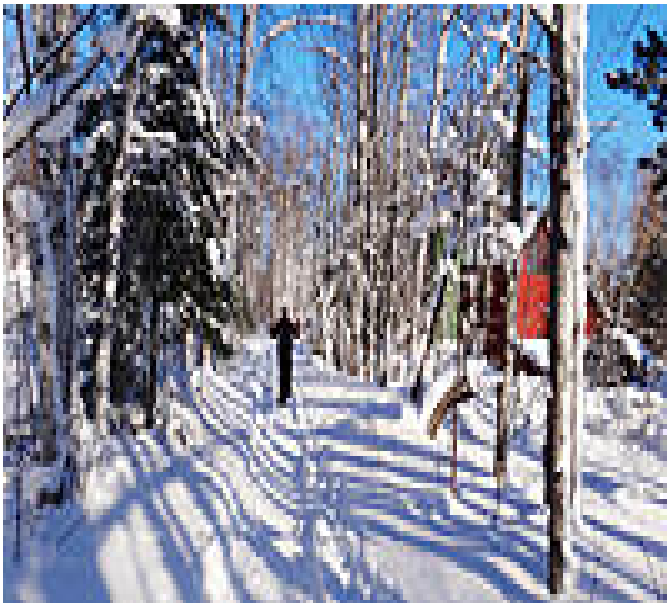

The Brownstone Trail runs for nearly 3 miles on an abandoned Chicago and North Western Railway corridor from the historic



The Brownstone Trail runs for nearly 3 miles on an abandoned Chicago and North Western Railway corridor from the historic downtown area of Bayfield, Wisconsin, to the Port Superior Marina south of the city. The trail follows the shoreline of Lake Superior, hugging the brownstone cliffs that give the trail its name. The entire area is a popular tourist destination advertised as the gateway to the nearby Apostle Islands National Lakeshore.

In the south, the rail-trail passes through a waterfront condominium community and Pikes Bay Marina before reaching its endpoint at the adjacent Port Superior Marina.

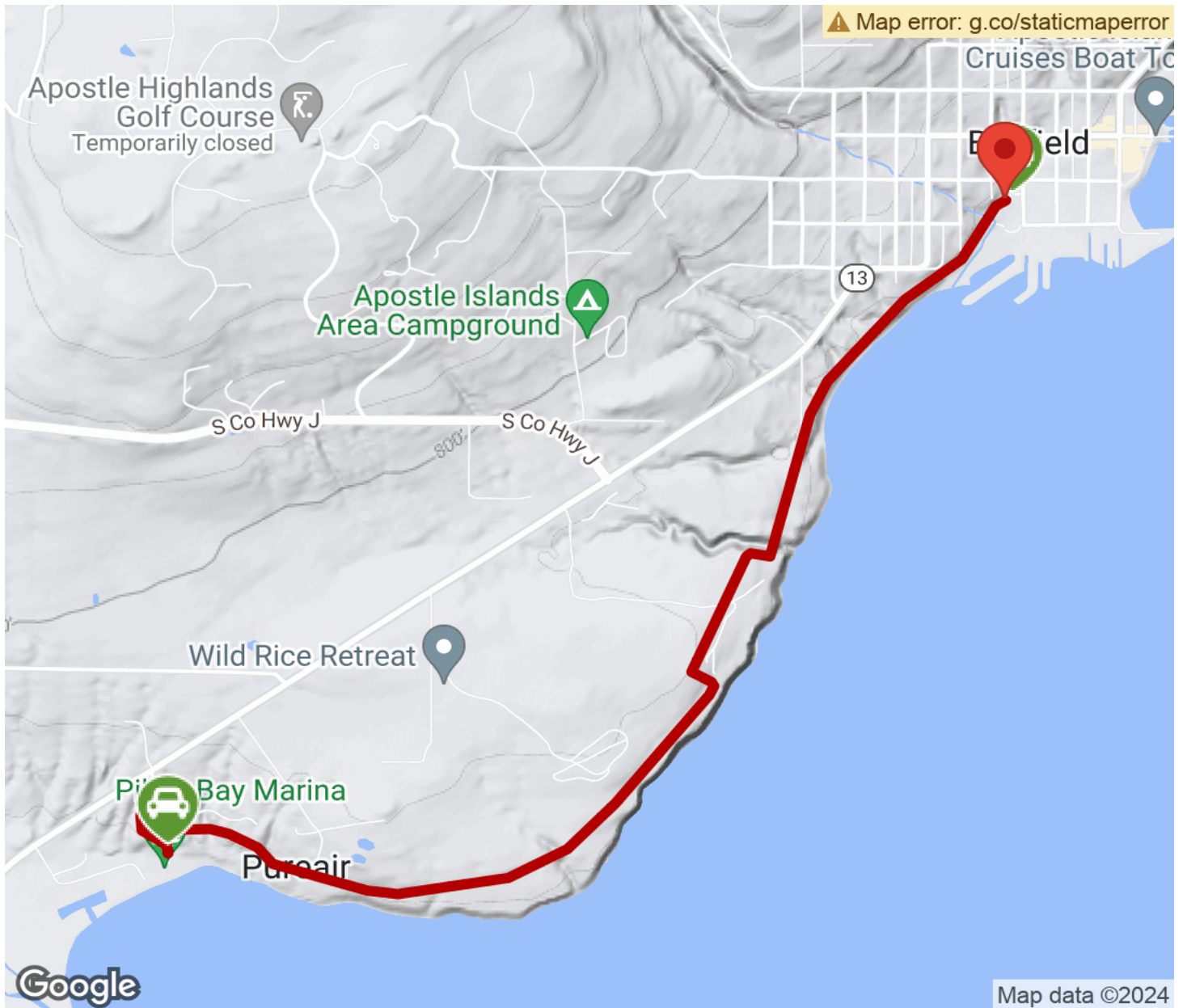
