Chelsea Community Wellness Path

Senior Center. This portion also passes by athletic fields used by students at nearby Chelsea High School.

The third stretch extends northwest from the loop on a former Detroit, Jackson and Chicago Railway corridor. Chelsea was one of the stops on the interurban line between Detroit and Jackson before it ceased operations in 1928. The woodchip trail runs for 0.75 mile on the former corridor through peaceful woodlands.

The Chelsea Community Wellness Path weaves through a large campus home to many of Chelsea's amenities. Although the total length of the trail is less than 2 miles, it is divided into three separate pathways offering their own unique experiences.

The longest stretch is a paved loop encircling the Silver Maples of Chelsea Retirement Community. Residents of the senior neighborhood contributed to the trail's development by measuring the planned route and creating trail markers. Other local residents got involved, too, such as an Eagle Scout candidate who contributed signs and benches.

A short, paved connector path leads from the main loop to the Washington Street Education Center and Chelsea

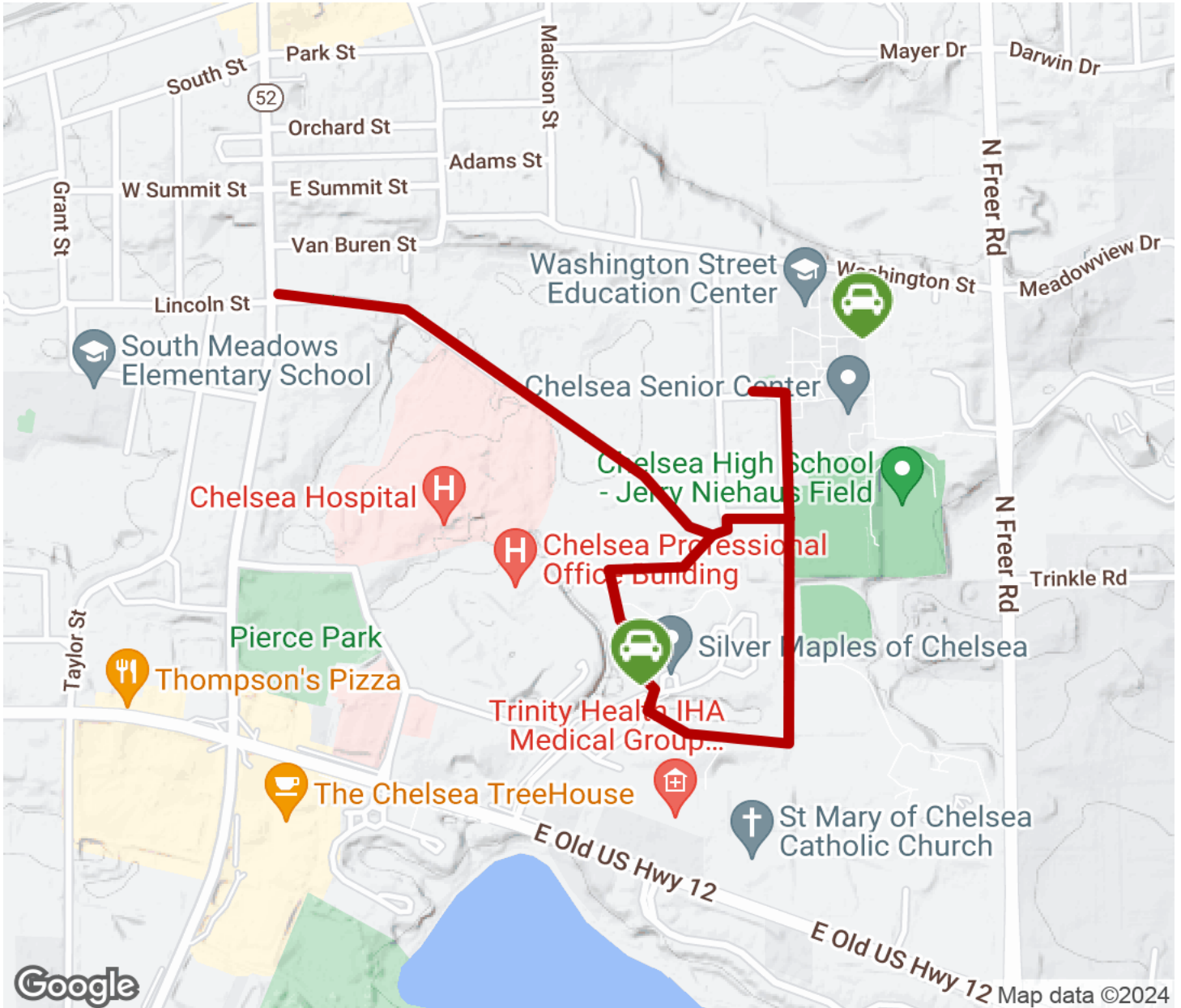
Parking & Trail Access
