The Pigeon Creek Greenway Passage is a multi-use trail in Evansville, part of which follows along the Ohio River and, of course, Pigeon Creek. The popular trail features scenic resting areas and interesting sculptures, with access to parks, neighborhoods and city attractions, such as the Museum of Arts.

There are plans to extend the trail to circumnavigate the city. The trail currently runs in a continuous course between Heidelbach Avenue, north of the city, and Sunset Park, along the river downtown. In 2018, the <u>Hi-Rail</u> <u>Greenway</u>, a north-south section of the trail system, opened and offers 2.5 miles of paved pathway.


Parking & Trail Access

The trail is widely accessible throughout Evansville. Parking is available at Sunset Park (Shawnee Drive near downtown along the river), at the end of 7th Avenue just south of Lloyd Expressway/SR 62, Lamasco Park (Iowa St. near the river), nearby Garvin Park (off Main St.) and at the end of Heidelbach Avenue.
