In summer, biking, inline skating, walking and jogging are popular trail activities. In winter, cross-country skiers and snowshoers come out en masse.

With a central spine spanning 20+ miles and a loop with additional spurs at its northern end, the trail serves as an important connector for the communities in the Wood River Valley and Sun Valley areas. For visitors, this also means that lodging, restaurants and other services are readily available along the trail.

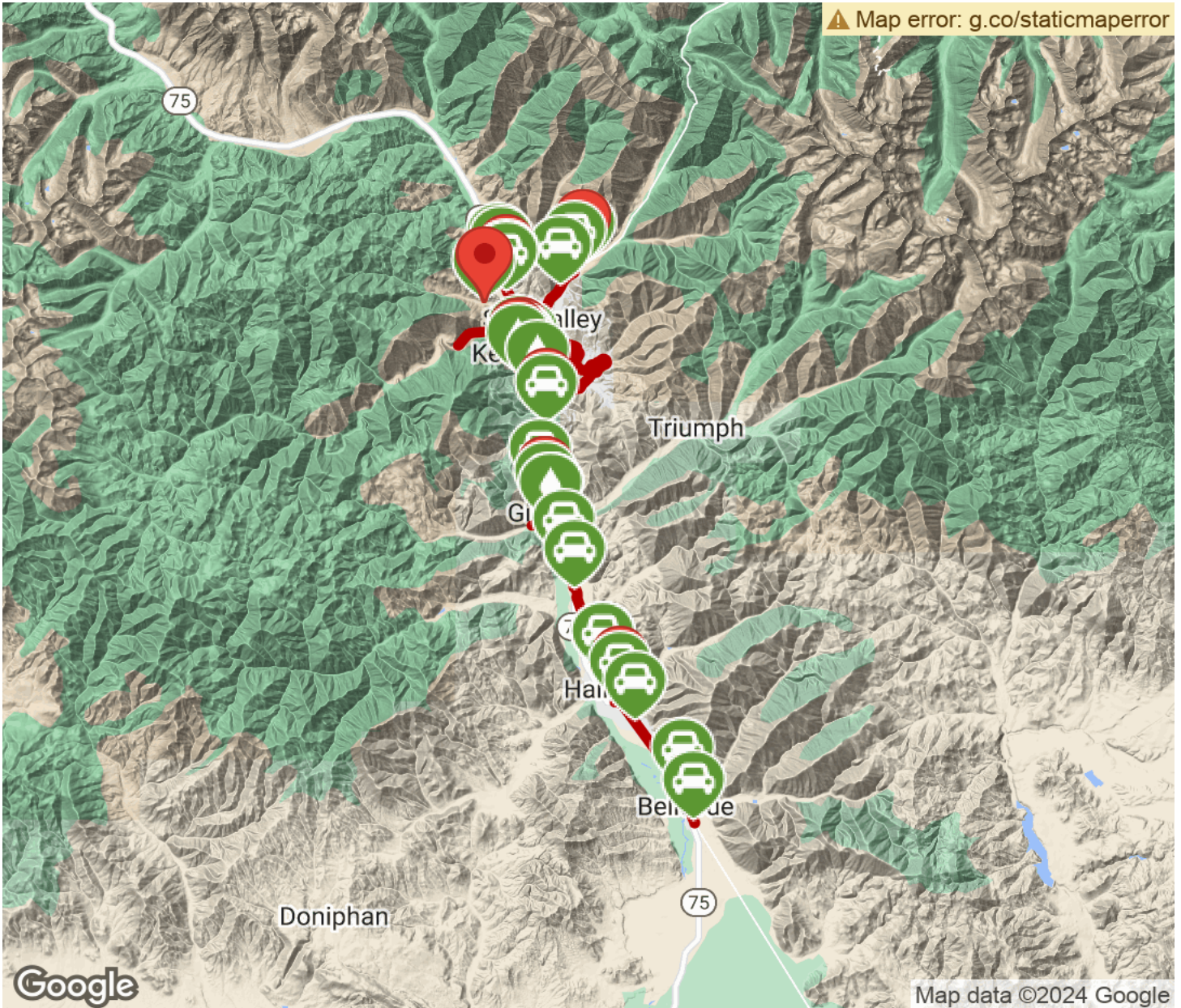
Parking & Trail Access
