Dunn-Erwin Rail-Trail

North Carolina



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The Dunn-Erwin Rail-Trail traverses the Aberdeen and Rockfish (previously Durham & Southern Railway) corridor in Harnett



Battlefield Museum and the Centennial Trail in downtown Erwin.

The Dunn-Erwin Rail-Trail traverses the Aberdeen and Rockfish (previously Durham & Southern Railway) corridor in Harnett County, North Carolina. It connects the downtown areas of Dunn and Erwin, coursing through the suburbs, light industrial areas and cotton fields, crossing the Black River and wetlands.

The Dunn-Erwin Rail-Trail is part of the East Coast Greenway; interpretive markers and signs relay the history of the area. The trail is also close to shops and restaurants.

Though the trail is gravel, wheelchair users will find the road-level route accessible. Nearby attractions include parks, the Cape Fear River, the Erwin History Room, the General Lee Airborne Museum, the Avera'sboro

Parking & Trail Access

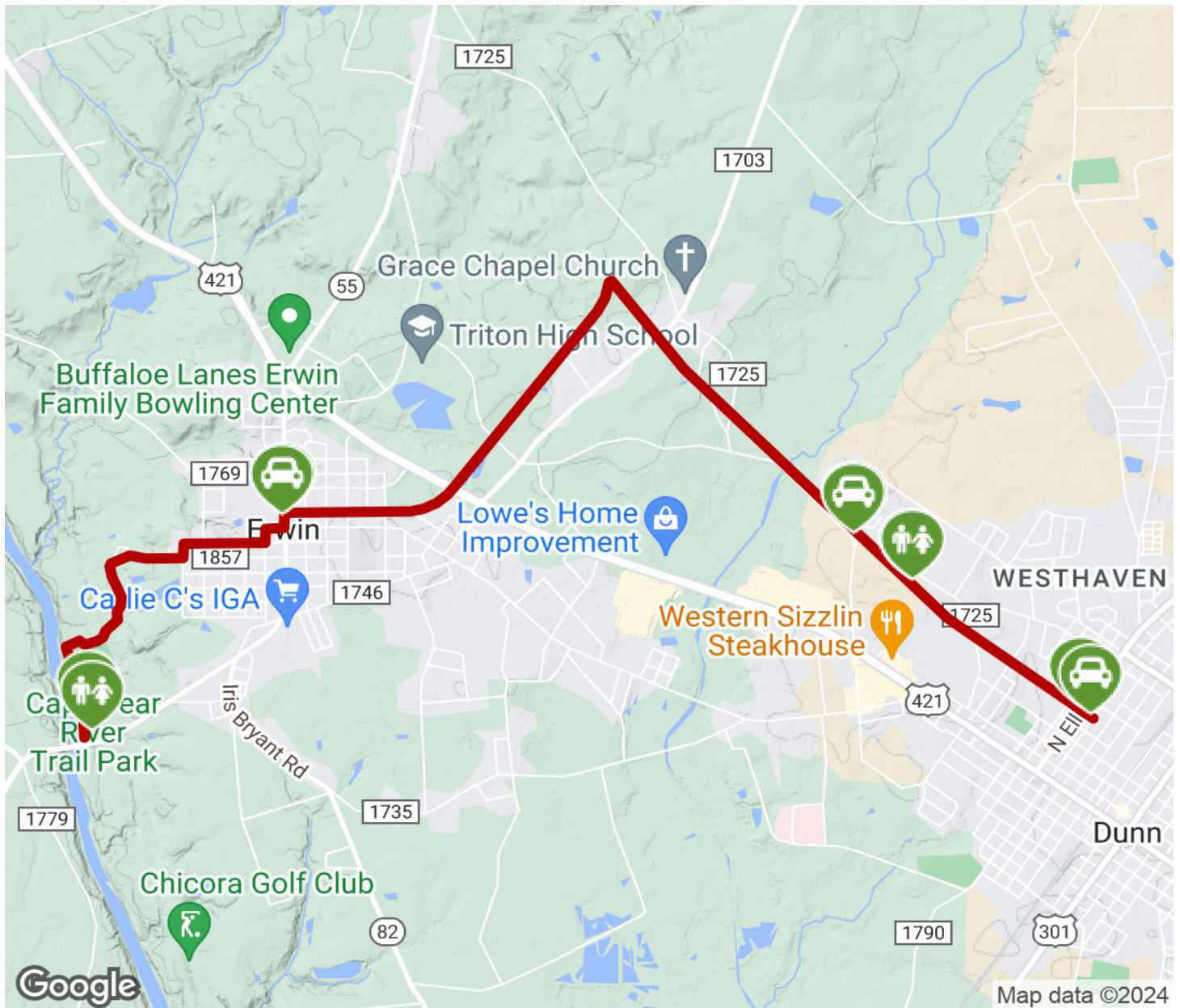
