Camden's Cooper River Park is found on both the north and south shores of Cooper River Lake. The urban park is open daily from



Farham Park.

The pathway is part of a larger effort called [The Circuit Trails](#) that aims to connect 750 miles of trail in the Camden and Philadelphia region.

Camden's Cooper River Park is found on both the north and south shores of Cooper River Lake. The urban park is open daily from dawn to dusk and offers a paved loop path for bikers and pedestrians, as well as other recreational facilities such as a boathouse and large playground. On the east side of the loop, the trail also extends out about a mile along S. Park Avenue through a residential area to Vesper Avenue.

The loop around Cooper River Park is around 3.7 miles and passes through the 346-acre park and encompassing wetland and grassland habitats and wildlife like egrets, herons, bald eagles and raptors.

Other sections of the trail pass through Pennypacker Park, Wallworth Pond & Challenger Grove Park and

Parking & Trail Access

There are a variety of parking options along the trail. At Gateway Park, trail users can park at 2798 Admiral Wilson Blvd. At the William G. Rohrer Children's Playground, look for parking at 5300 N Park Dr. Additionally there is parking at the Cooper River Kayak Landing (510 Park Blvd) and Challenge Grove Park (101 Bortons Mill Rd).


