## Columbus Fall Line Trace

*The Columbus Fall Line Trace trail runs between the 14th Street pedestrian bridge in Uptown and Psalmont Road Recreation*



The Columbus Fall Line Trace trail runs between the 14th Street pedestrian bridge in Uptown and Psalmont Road Recreation Center in Midland. It follows the former right-of-way of the Norfolk Southern Railroad, paralleling Warm Springs Road. Some road crossings are busy so take care at intersections. You can access the trail from park-and-ride lots and also from where the trail intersects with METRA bus routes.

The trail joins the [Chattahoochee Riverwalk](#) and, combined, the two trails can be linked for a 26-mile trek between Fort Benning and Columbus. Both trails are part of the city's developing Dragonfly Trails network, which will span more than 60 miles when complete.

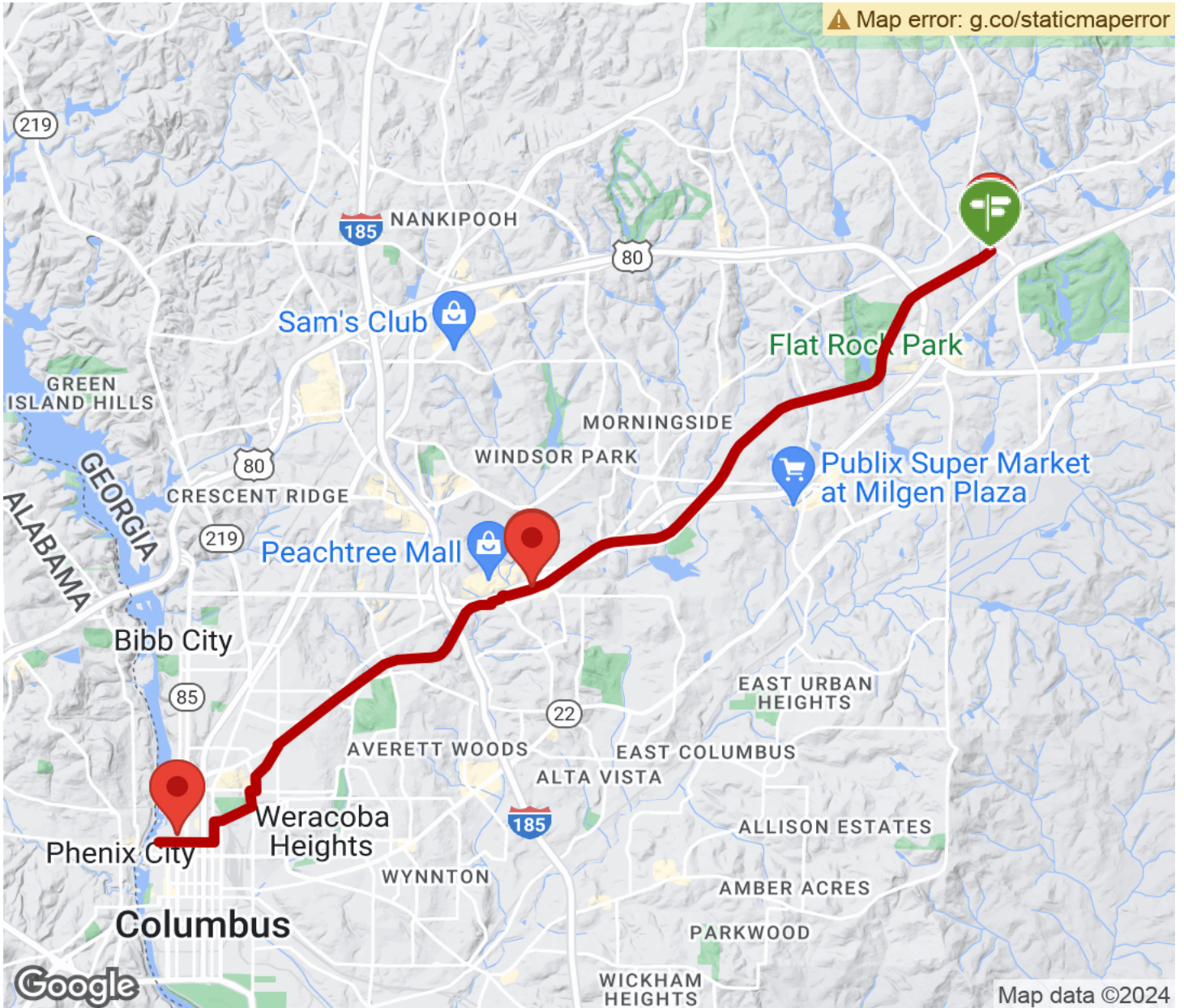
## Parking & Trail Access

Parking for the Columbus Fall Line Trace is available at Midland Elementary and Middle schools, Flat Rock Park, Cooper Creek Park, Columbus State University campus, Hardaway High, and at park and ride lots near Hannan Magnet Academy on Warm Springs Road and on Manchester Expressway across from Legacy Chevrolet. In addition, you can access the trail just about anywhere it crosses a road and from the northern end of the Chattahoochee Riverwalk.
