East 224 Connector **Trail** Utah



The East 224 Connector Trail provides a convenient route through South Snyderville Basin from Willow Creek Park to the Redstone



The East 224 Connector Trail provides a convenient route through South Snyderville Basin from Willow Creek Park to the Redstone Shopping Complex. It meanders north along the former Denver and Rio Grande Western Railroad right-of-way for just over a mile, then parallels State Route 224 before approaching the Swaner Nature Reserve, a scenic wetland and meadow habitat with an award-winning educational facility. The path is packed dirt and stone with two boardwalk segments through wetlands.

The trail connects to the asphalt-surfaced <u>224 Connector</u> <u>Trail</u> at its northern end and the <u>McLeod Creek Trail</u>, <u>Split Rail Trail</u> and <u>Willow Creek Trail</u> to the south.
