## Noonday Creek Trail

Georgia

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The Noonday Creek Trail is open in two disconnected sections. The short, northernmost segment runs through the southwestern end of Woodstock, following its namesake tree-lined creek. At this section's north end, it directly connects to the [Town to Creek Trail](#), which continues for just over a half-mile into downtown. At the trail's southern end is Highway 92, which is lined with shops and restaurants.

Another 6-mile portion, located in Cobb County, travels along the southern side of Old 41 Highway and up to Bells Ferry Road between Kennesaw State University and the Cobb Town Center. At its southern end is Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park, a nearly 3,000-acre park that provides Civil War history and hiking opportunities.

## Parking & Trail Access

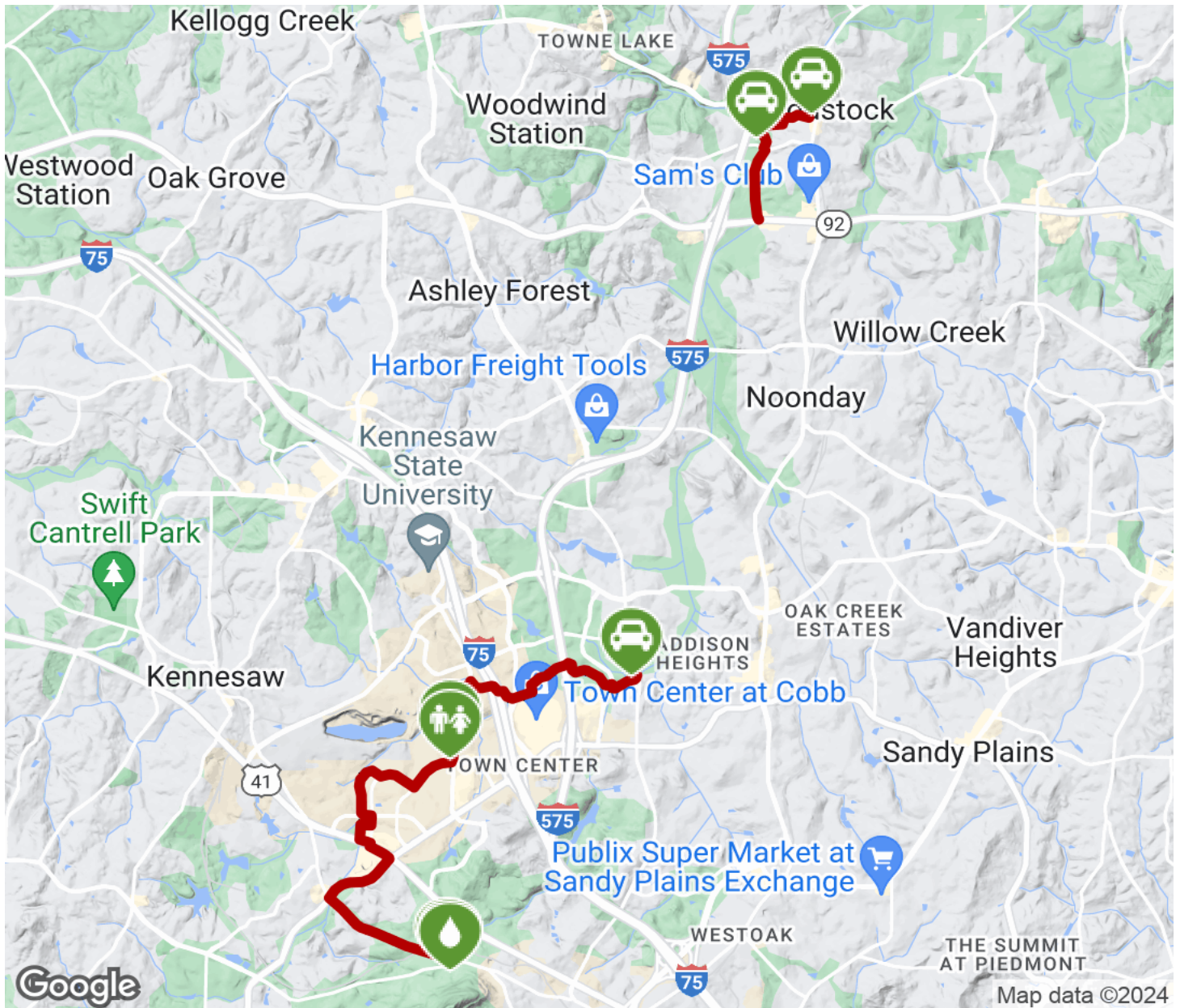
For the northern segment of the trail, parking is available at Woodstock Dog Park (150 Dupree Rd., Woodstock), which is easily accessible by hopping on the adjoining Town to Creek Trail.

For the southern segment, parking is available at both ends: Kennesaw National Battlefield Park (1201 Old 41 Highway NW, Kennesaw) and at 3001 Bells Ferry Road in Marietta.
