## Spring Creek Trail (AR)

Arkansas

*The Spring Creek Trail courses along its namesake waterway through Springdale, a growing community in Northwest Arkansas.*



All four trails are central components of the [Razorback Regional Greenway](#), a 46-mile, primarily off-road, shared-use trail that extends from southeast Bella Vista to the southern edge of Fayetteville.

The Spring Creek Trail courses along its namesake waterway through Springdale, a growing community in Northwest Arkansas. While the trail's southern half passes through the city's urban heart, the northern end winds through scenic open space periodically marked by stands of trees.

In the north, the trail provides convenient access to Lake Springdale, administered as part of nearby JB Hunt Park and popular with local fishermen. Pick up the [Lake Springdale Trail](#) encircling the body of water for a relaxing stroll or bike ride. At the Spring Creek Trail's southern end, hop on the short [Park Street Trail](#) to reach the [Powell Street Trail](#), on which you can extend your journey all the way to Fayetteville.

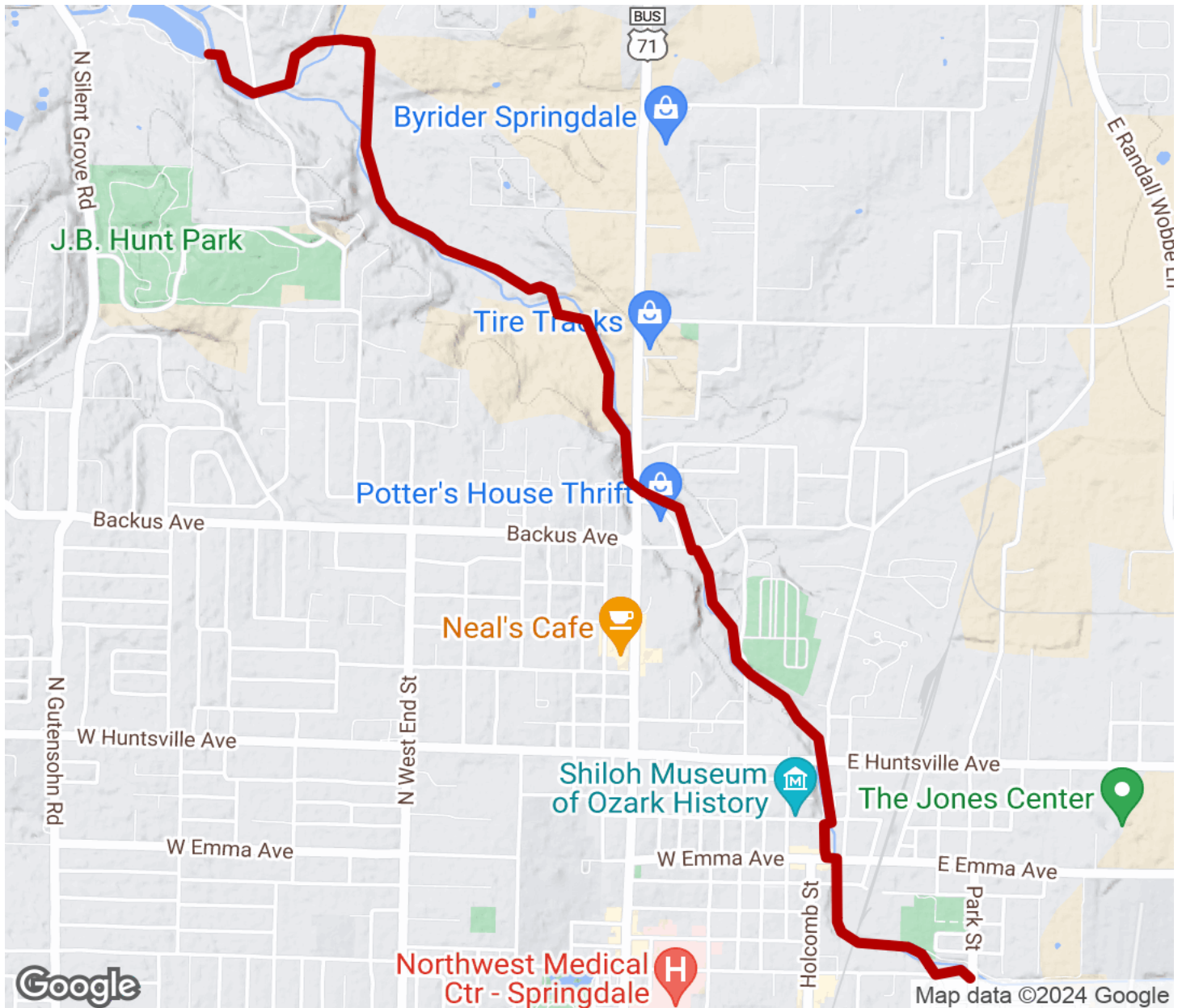
## Parking & Trail Access
