The Livingston Depot Center Trail begins at the community's beautifully restored train station, built in 1902 by Northern Pacific



The Livingston Depot Center Trail begins at the community's beautifully restored train station, built in 1902 by Northern Pacific Railroad that today houses a railroad museum open Memorial Day through Labor Day. From the depot, the paved trail heads west nestled between active railroad tracks on its north side and W. Park Street along its south side. Tall shady trees make the route pleasant and the trail makes a useful connector across this small town that's big on Old West charm.

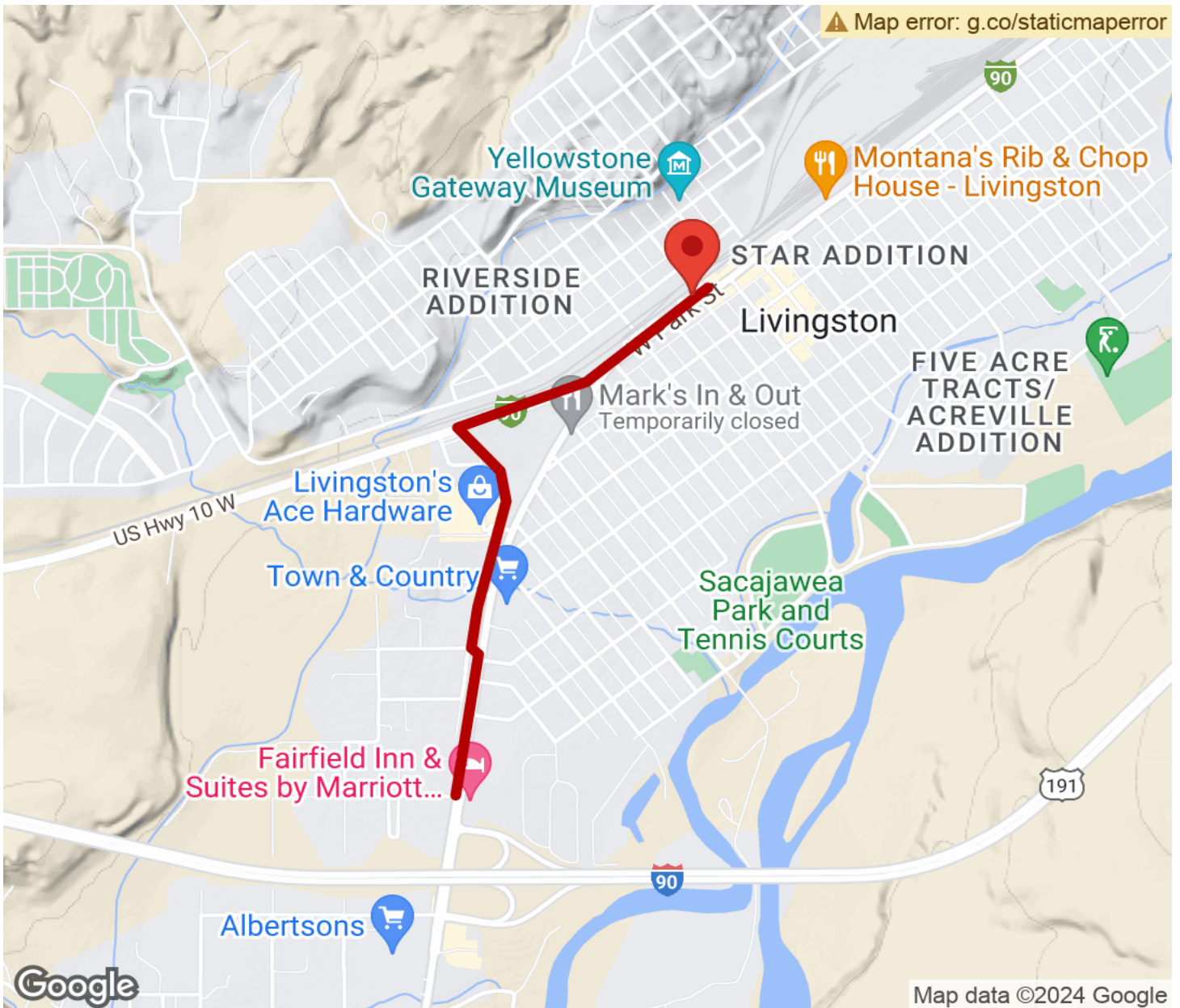
Parking & Trail Access
