# Cushing Park Road Recreational Trail (Route of the Badger)

*The Cushing Park Road Recreational Trail begins on the western outskirts of Delafield, a small community about 30 miles west of*



The Cushing Park Road Recreational Trail begins on the western outskirts of Delafield, a small community about 30 miles west of Milwaukee. From Delafield's Main Street, the trail heads south, paralleling Cushing Park Road but separated from the roadway by a comfortable margin. The paved pathway crosses the Lapham Peak Unit of the Kettle Moraine State Forest and traverses prairie landscapes.

Spanning 3 miles, the route is not especially long, but it is an important connector in the regional trail network as it connects to the [Lake County Recreation Trail](#) on its north end and the [Glacial Drumlin State Trail](#) at its southern end. Hikers will also enjoy the pathway's connection to the Ice Age Trail.

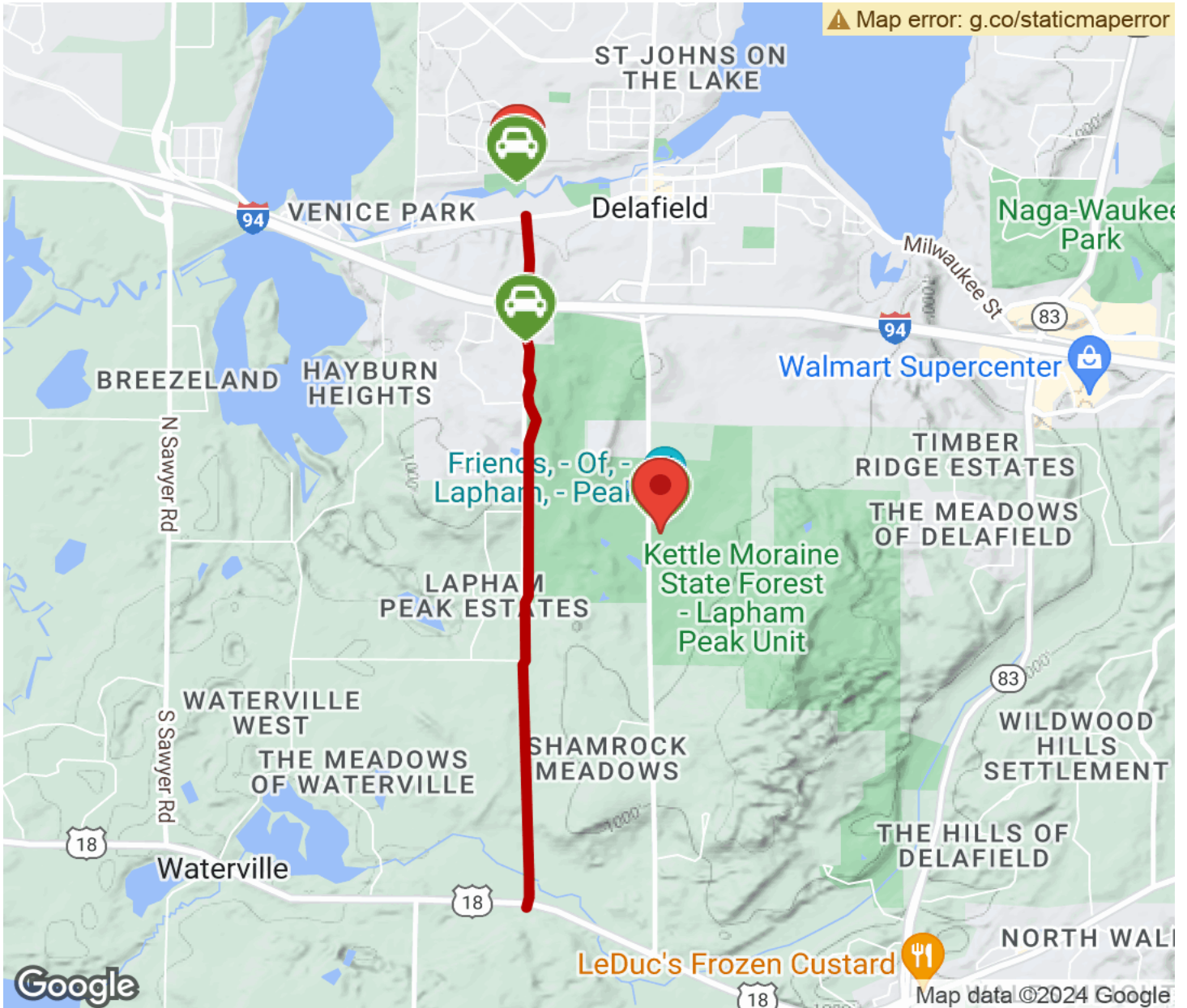
## Parking & Trail Access
