The KR Trail is a new addition to Kenosha County's growing bike-ped network. The trail picks up where the Kenosha Pike Bike Trail



The KR Trail is a new addition to Kenosha County's growing bike-ped network. The trail picks up where the [Kenosha Pike Bike Trail](#) leaves off, in Petrifying Springs Park. From the northwest corner of the park, the trail launches with winding boardwalk over Pike River. The surface then transitions to asphalt for the rest of its 1.5-mile route parallel to Green Bay Road (Highway 31). Near the end, the trail crosses the highway and begins to parallel Highway KR up to its terminal point at 56th Avenue. Signalized crossings help path users get safely across the roads.

The KR Trail is part of the Route of the Bager, a Milwaukee-area trail network.

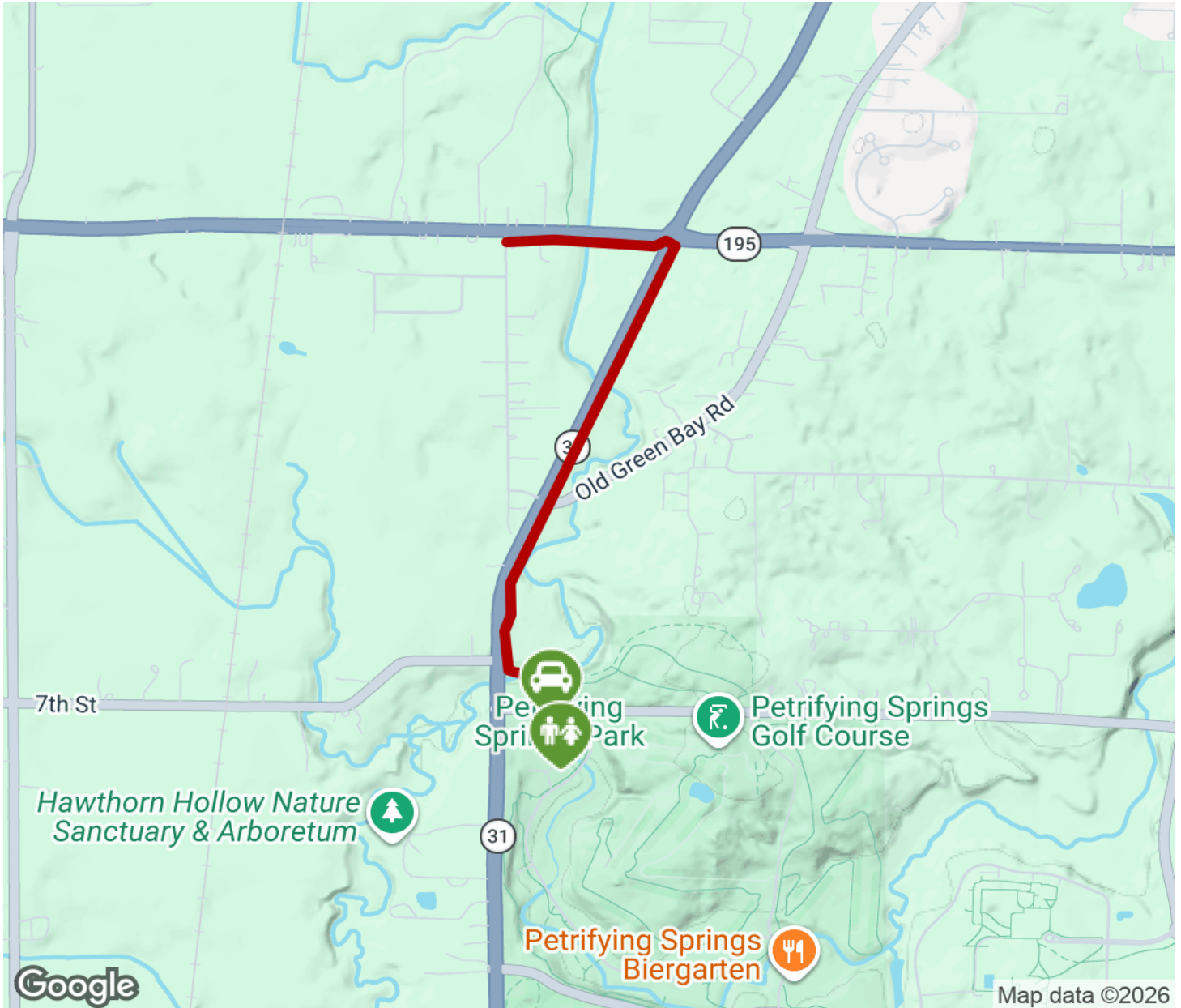
