Trans-Florida Central Railroad Trail

The Trans-Florida Central Railroad Trail is a 3.2-mile hiking and biking trail that sits along a former railroad corridor that once



found as the trail approaches the 1-95 overpass. Additionally, most of the route is far from road traffic and noise, giving the trail a peaceful and secluded feel.

The Trans-Florida Central Railroad Trail is a 3.2-mile hiking and biking trail that sits along a former railroad corridor that once connected Sebastian and Fellsmere. The centerpiece of the trail is the iconic bridge over Interstate 95: a broad walkway with two arches, meant to invoke images of the railroad bridges of a bygone era. The name of the trail is displayed prominently in huge letters across the span of the bridge.

About the Route

Riders and hikers can travel on the paved off-road trail between the Mesa Motorcross Park, across I-95, and the North Indian River County Regional Park in Sebastian.

The entire trail is flat, with the only incline along the trail

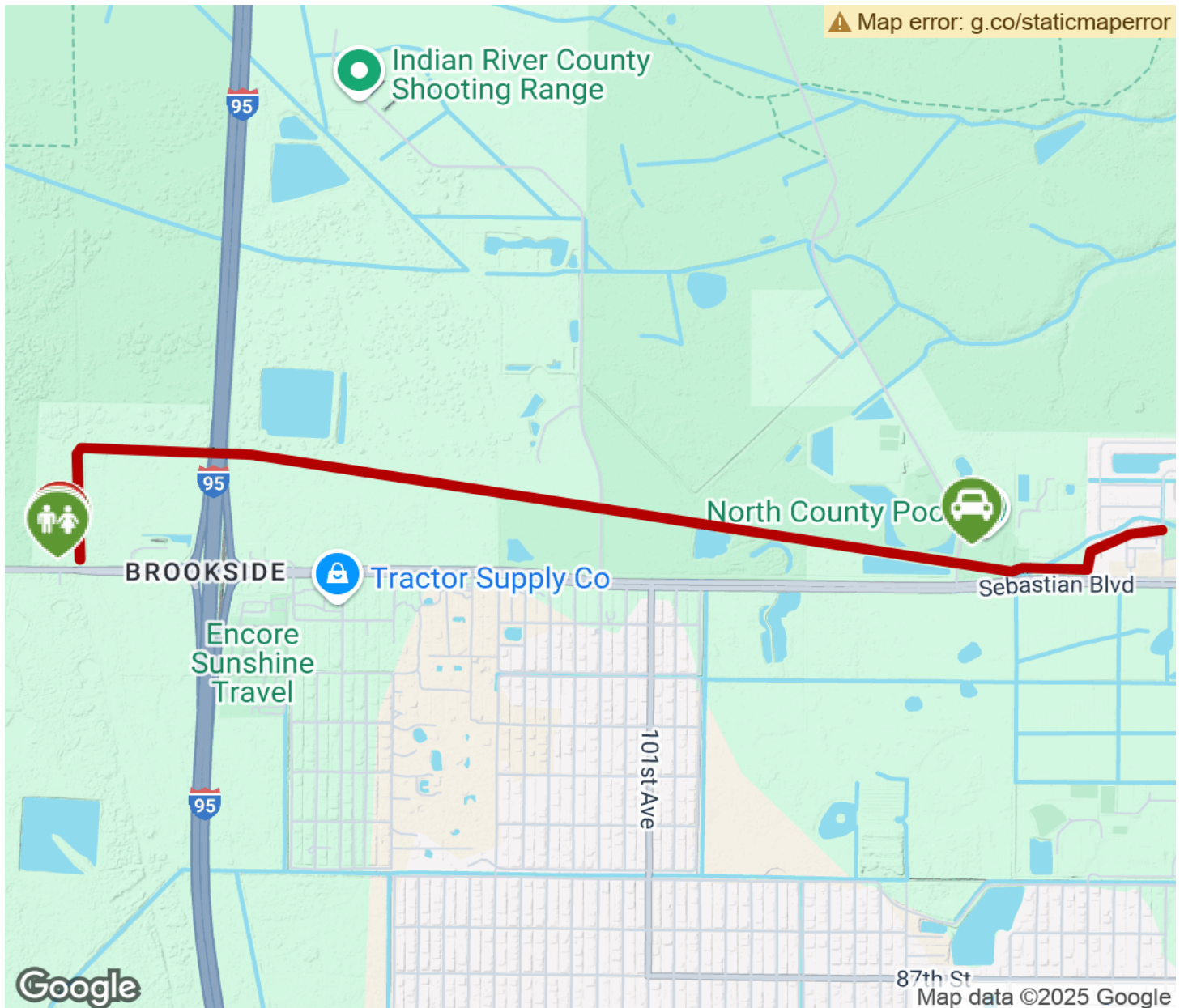
