Eastrail South Washington



The Eastrail (or formerly, Eastside Rail Corridor Trail), built on a former BNSF freight railroad, will one day traverse 42 miles



Eastrail (South) makes up the southernmost end of the entire Eastrail is located near Renton's Gene Coulon Memorial Beach Park, where travelers will find a boat launch, swimming beach, and a playground. From there, the trail heads northward, tucked between Lake Washington and residential neighborhoods along Lake Washington Boulevard. The trail is largely tree-lined, but trail users will have glimpses of the lake along the way.

Bellevue's Newcastle Beach Park is near the northern end of the trail, where trail users can enjoy swimming and picnicking, and have access to a children's play area and a nature trail.

Trail users should note that the southernmost section of the trail in Gene Coulon Park is off limits to bike traffic.

Connections

The southern end of the trail is near to the Cedar River Trail.

The Eastrail (or formerly, Eastside Rail Corridor Trail), built on a former BNSF freight railroad, will one day traverse 42 miles through King County, connecting Renton, Bellevue, Kirkland, Redmond, and Woodinville. It will also serve as a "spine" in the area's trail systems, by connecting 175+ miles of trails.

Right now the trail is open in several segments, some of which have their own separate trail identities including Eastrail North, Jane Hague Way, Cross Kirkland Corridor and the Redmond Central Connector. Eastrail (South) makes up the southernmost portion of this trail network.
