The vision for a trail along Cedar Creek was borne in the 1940s', thanks to the man who would eventually lend his name to the project. Bill Klingner worked with the Quincy Park District and the foresight to bet on walking and biking at a time when cars were king. Today the greenway starts in Bob May's Park and crosses back and forth over the Cedar Creek as it winds west towards the Mississippi River and east toward N 24th Street. When completed the trail will extend to N 36th. At present planning is underway for the extension from 24th to 30th streets.


## Parking & Trail Access
