Parking and trail access can be found Our Saviors Lutheran Church, at the western end of the trail.



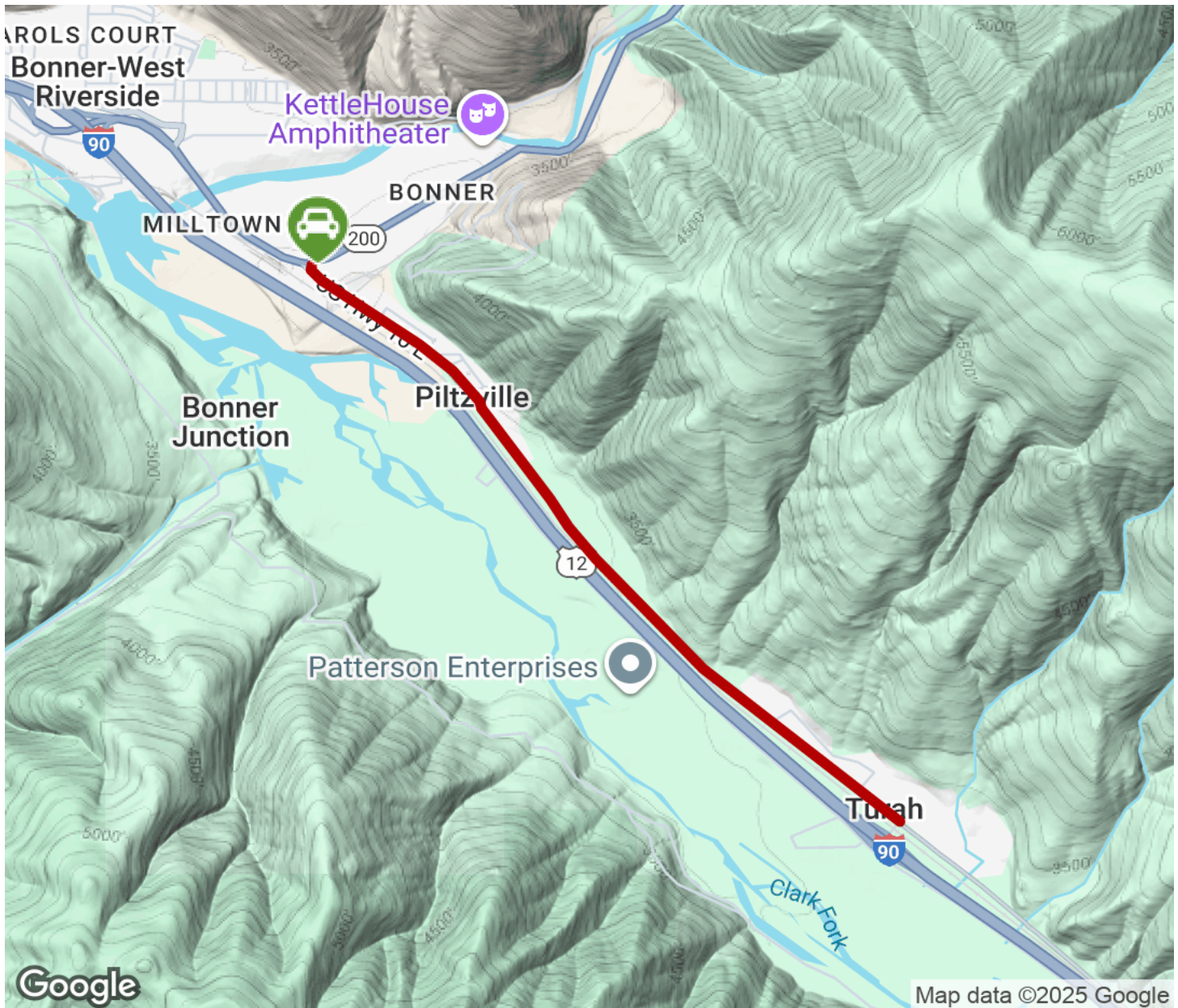
