The Roadrunner Trail forms an almost a complete loop in Mesquite, connecting neighborhoods, schools and several parks. Be sure to bring water and be prepared for little shade along the route.

Beginning at Desert Rose Park—which offers a covered picnic pavilion and restrooms—you can travel counterclockwise about 4 miles through the city. You'll skirt along a residential area and next arrive at Jensen Trailside Park, where parking, restrooms and a drinking fountain are available, as well as a dog park, playground and picnic area.

As the trail begins to make its circuit and turn east, you'll traverse Hafen Park—a nice place for a rest with a fishing pond and views of the mountains. Heading north, you'll



hit three more parks on your journey northward: Pulsipher Park, Library Park and Old Mill Park. The trail ends at Woodbury Lane.
