Las Cruces is a city in southern New Mexico, about 50 minutes north of El Paso, Texas. The Triviz Multi-Use Path is one of the paved recreational paths found in the city. It is located in the west of the Las Cruces, along a dense neighborhoods and businesses. The trail travels from north to south, starting at the intersection with the perpendicular Outfall Channel Trail, then heading southwest along Triviz Drive before halting on University Avenue at the New Mexico State University campus.

The trail is four-and-a-half miles long, but thanks to the connectivity of the trails, you could actually extend your walk, run or ride by taking the [Outfall Channel Trail](#) another 4.4 miles west to the Rio Grande River, and the [La Llorona Multi-Use Path](#) an equal distance south to the Town of Mesilla.

There is no dedicated parking for the trail but there may be on-street or commercial parking at nearby businesses.




