The Druid Road Trail is a vital link in Pinellas County's extensive trail system, connecting two of its most prominent trails:

The Druid Road Trail is a vital link in Pinellas County's extensive trail system, connecting two of its most prominent trails: the [Pinellas Trail](#), which stretches for 50 miles from St. Petersburg to Tarpon Springs, and the [Duke Energy Trail](#). Both trails are part of the eventual 75-mile chain of trails known as the [Pinellas Trail Loop](#).

The Druid Road Trail is four miles long, paved all the way and is accessible to the many residents of Clearwater whose neighborhoods border Druid Road. The trail's surface resembles a wide sidewalk and offers a smooth, off-road experience. At its western end, the trail connects to the Pinellas Trail. At its eastern end, it links with the Duke Energy Trail.

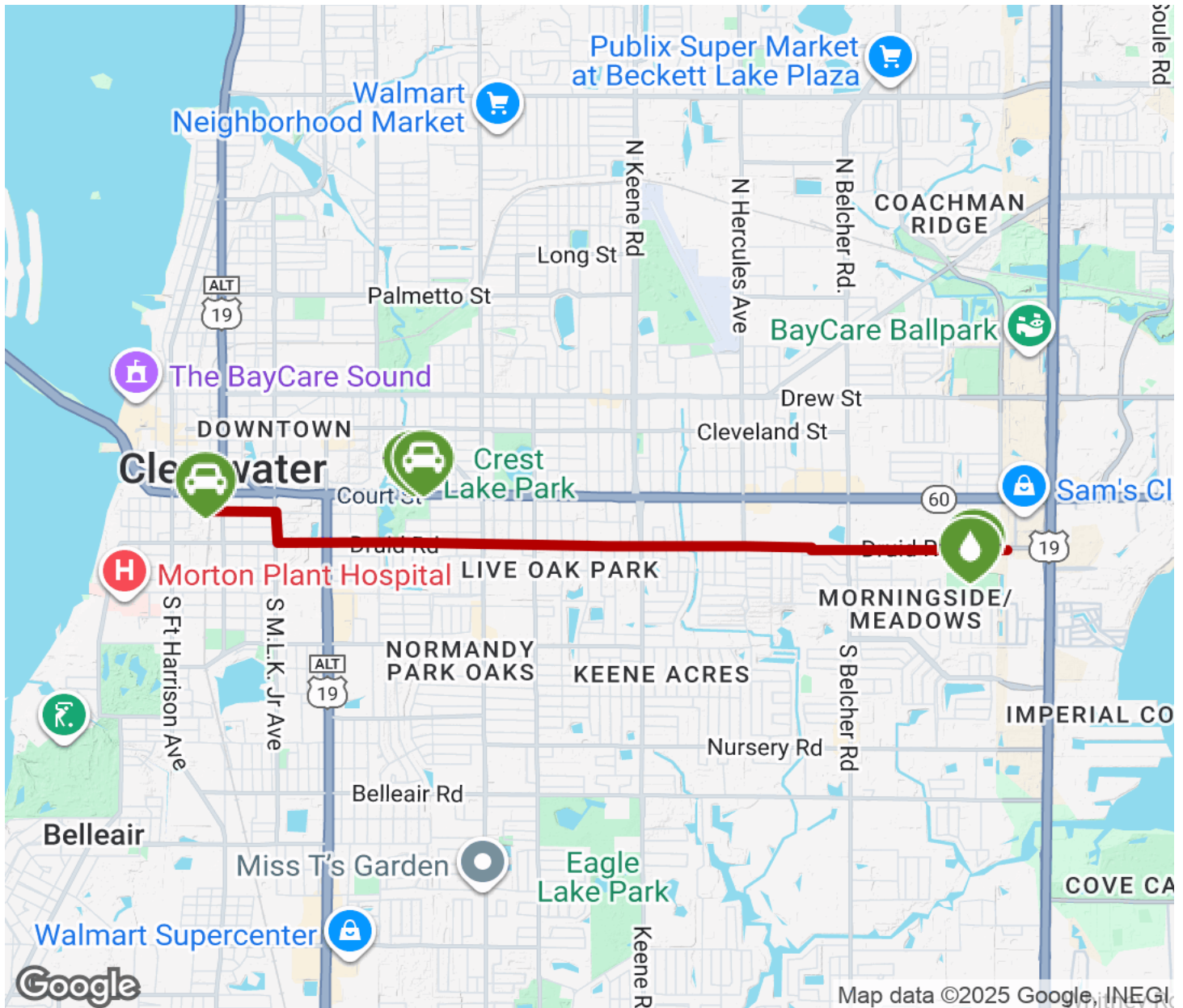
