Pigeon Forge's Riverwalk Greenway is a beautiful multi-use trail in the resort town of Pigeon Forge in eastern Tennessee. About the



The trail is open for use 24 hours a day, thanks to the lighting provided. Benches are placed at intervals along the route. Pedestrians, cyclists, inline skaters, and users with leashed dogs are all welcome to enjoy.

About the Route

While the town is better known for its tourist attractions (it's home to Dollywood, a Dolly Parton-themed amusement park!), the Riverwalk Greenway is still worth a visit, a place to take a time-out within a serene natural setting. The paved trail begins by looping behind the Pigeon Creek Community Center, before it meets the West Prong of the Little Pigeon River. Staying close to the river, the trail stretches south to the Island entertainment complex and then continues down to Patriot Park, where it closes with a 1/2-mile loop.

Parking & Trail Access

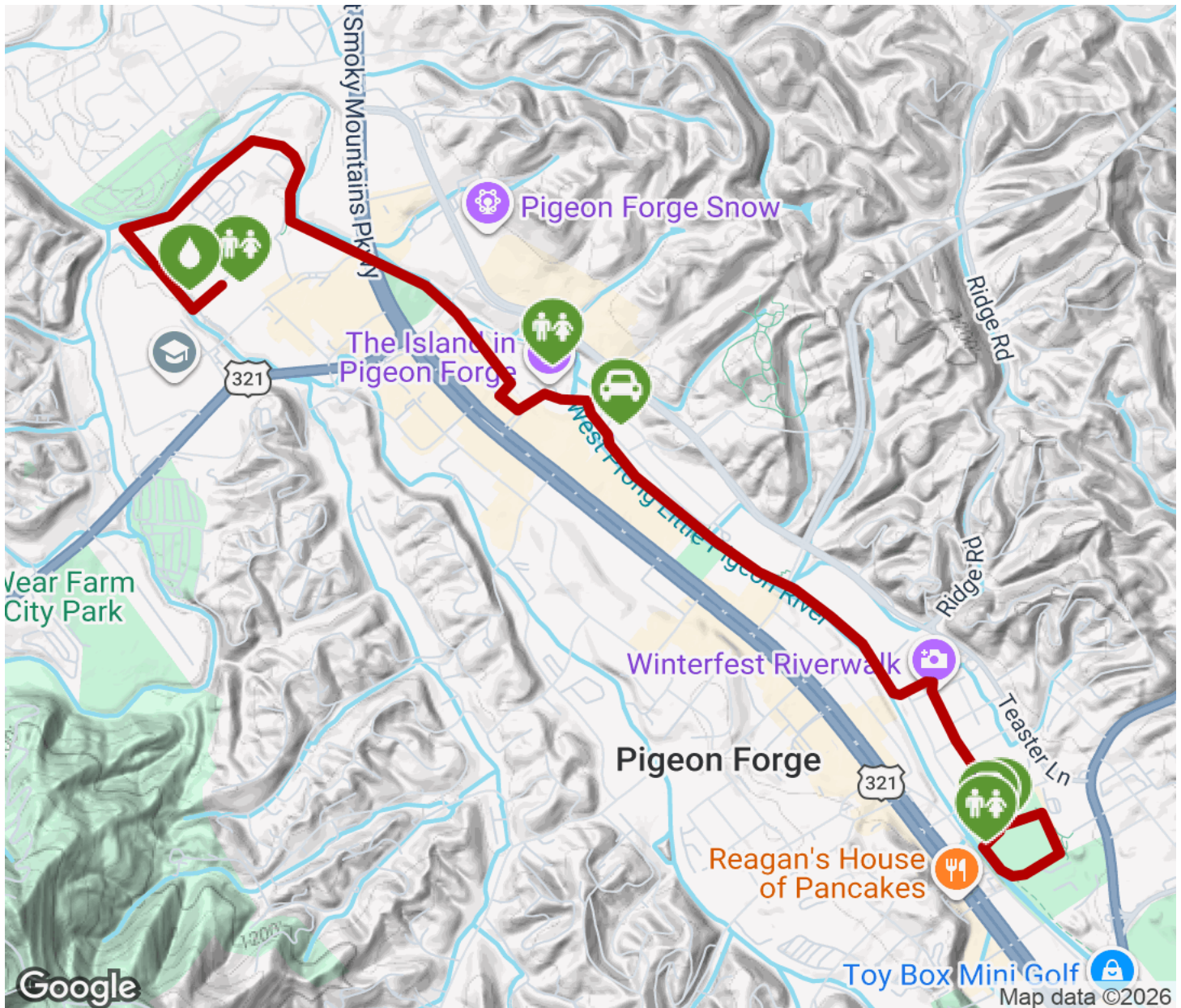
