Wright Brothers Multi-Use Path

North Carolina



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Kitty Hawk is a charming seaside town in the Outer Banks, but it was the Wright Brothers of Ohio who put it on the map when in 1903, they piloted the first ever successful flight. The two names are now intertwined, and the town is more than happy to celebrate the connection. The Wright Brothers Multi-Use path is named for the pioneering inventors and airmen and is a 2500-foot concrete path facing Kitty Hawk Bay. The path extends from Windgrass Circle Park north to Beacon Drive, offering uninterrupted sea views.

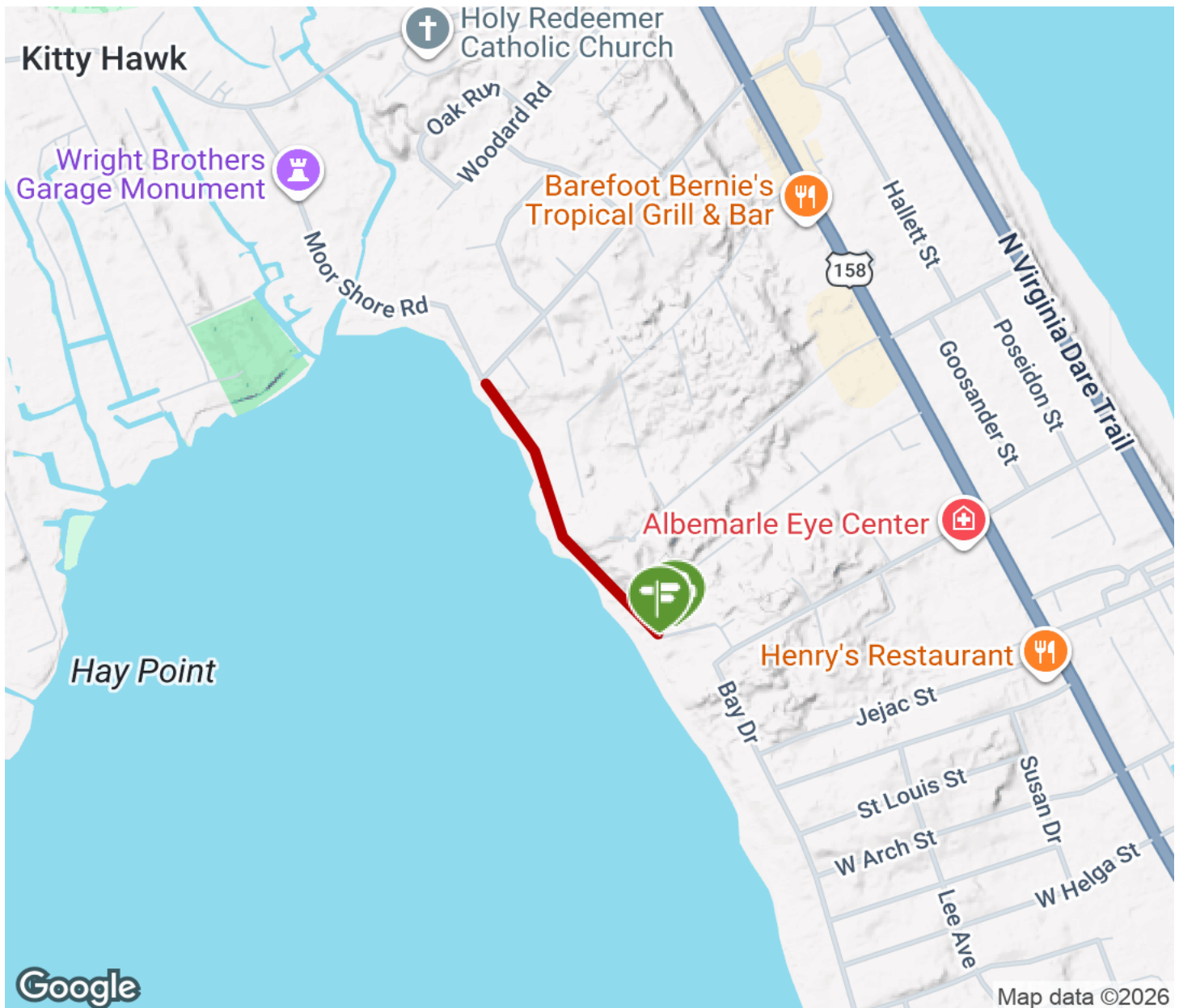
