Located in the small city of Holstein, in rural Ida County, Iowa, the Holstein Community Trail is a smooth, concrete trail for walking and biking that spans most of the southeastern edge of town. The trail begins in the south at the city's Lohff-Schumann Community Center, a popular local destination for fitness and athletic activities, and then runs east and north along the outskirts of the city limits.

The trail offers some gorgeous views of the Iowa farmland that surrounds Holstein, allowing trail users to disappear into nature not far from their own backyards. Passing around the athletic fields behind the local high school, the trail comes to an end along East 2nd Street, a short distance east of the community's charming downtown. Local officials hope to extend the trail further north to
