The Lincolnshire Trail is an asphalt pathway that shoots off from the longer Douglas State Trail, providing a short spur that gives

The Lincolnshire Trail is an asphalt pathway that shoots off from the longer [Douglas State Trail](#), providing a short spur that gives cyclists and pedestrians access to the Lincolnshire-Arbor Glen neighborhood in northwest Rochester. The path leaves the rail-trail in a lovely, tree-lined corridor, surrounded by suburban parks and fields, but the trail quickly encounters suburbia as it passes along the edge of a huge shopping complex along 55th Street. Sidewalks can lead trail users east of the trail to Lincolnshire Park, home to a variety of athletic fields and open space.

The path crosses over the highway and comes to an end at Georgetowne Drive; on the north side of the road, the East 55th Street Bike Path continues east for another mile, leading to the start of the [Zumbro North Trail](#), and

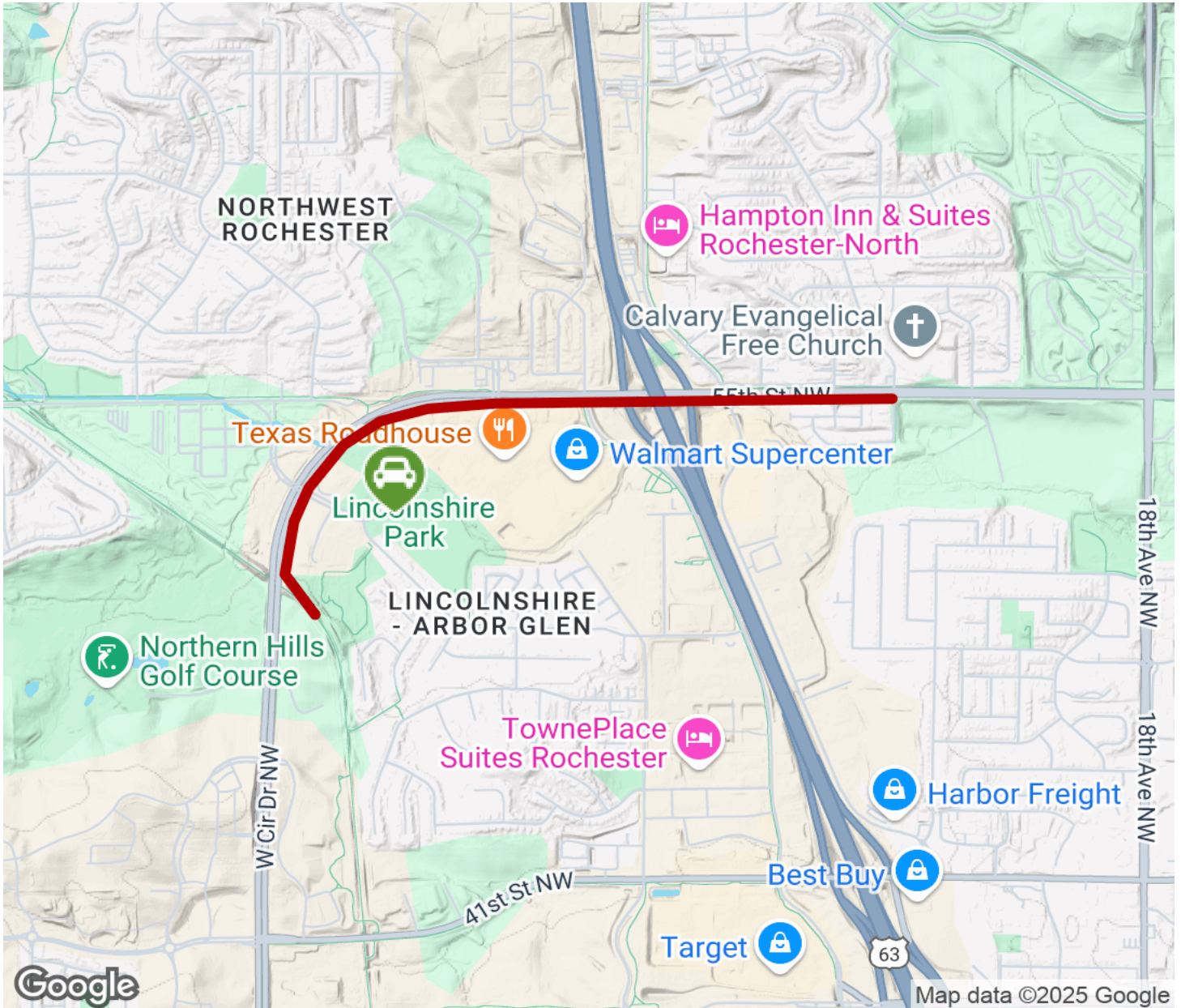
Parking & Trail Access
