Thanks to its proximity to Fort Carson, the area residents are largely military families. The trail travels from the [Fountain Creek Regional Trail](#) to Creek Regional Trail to Fountain Mesa Road, on the southern border of Bluestem Prairie Open Space. In between, the trail whose mixed surface switches between gravel and concrete travels along a narrow creek and passes through local parks including John Ceresa Memorial Park and Widefield Park. The latter park is 17 acres of multipurpose park space with facilities for baseball, basketball and disc golf.


