Warren Creek Trail

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The northernmost segment of Durham's North-South Greenway, Warren Creek Trail provides a serene hiking or biking experience



bike parking and a water fountain at this point. Turn left and continue traveling between the tennis courts until the trail becomes like it was before: bounded by trees and greenery through which one might occasionally spot the creek.

The trail ends at Stadium Drive, where a concrete sidepath continues the journey south.

The northernmost segment of Durham's North-South Greenway, Warren Creek Trail provides a serene hiking or biking experience and access to a neighborhood park.

The trail extends between Horton Road and Stadium Drive, through Whippoorwill Park and largely following the course of its namesake creek. Beginning at Horton Road, the paved trail travels through cuts a 10-foot wide swath through the riparian woods surrounding Warren Creek. Leafy branches form a canopy above while foliage blankets the ground on the sides of the path.

The trail emerges from the woods into the Whippoorwill Park parking area. There turn left and walk or ride the path between the parking spaces and the split rail fence until you come to the tennis courts. There are benches,

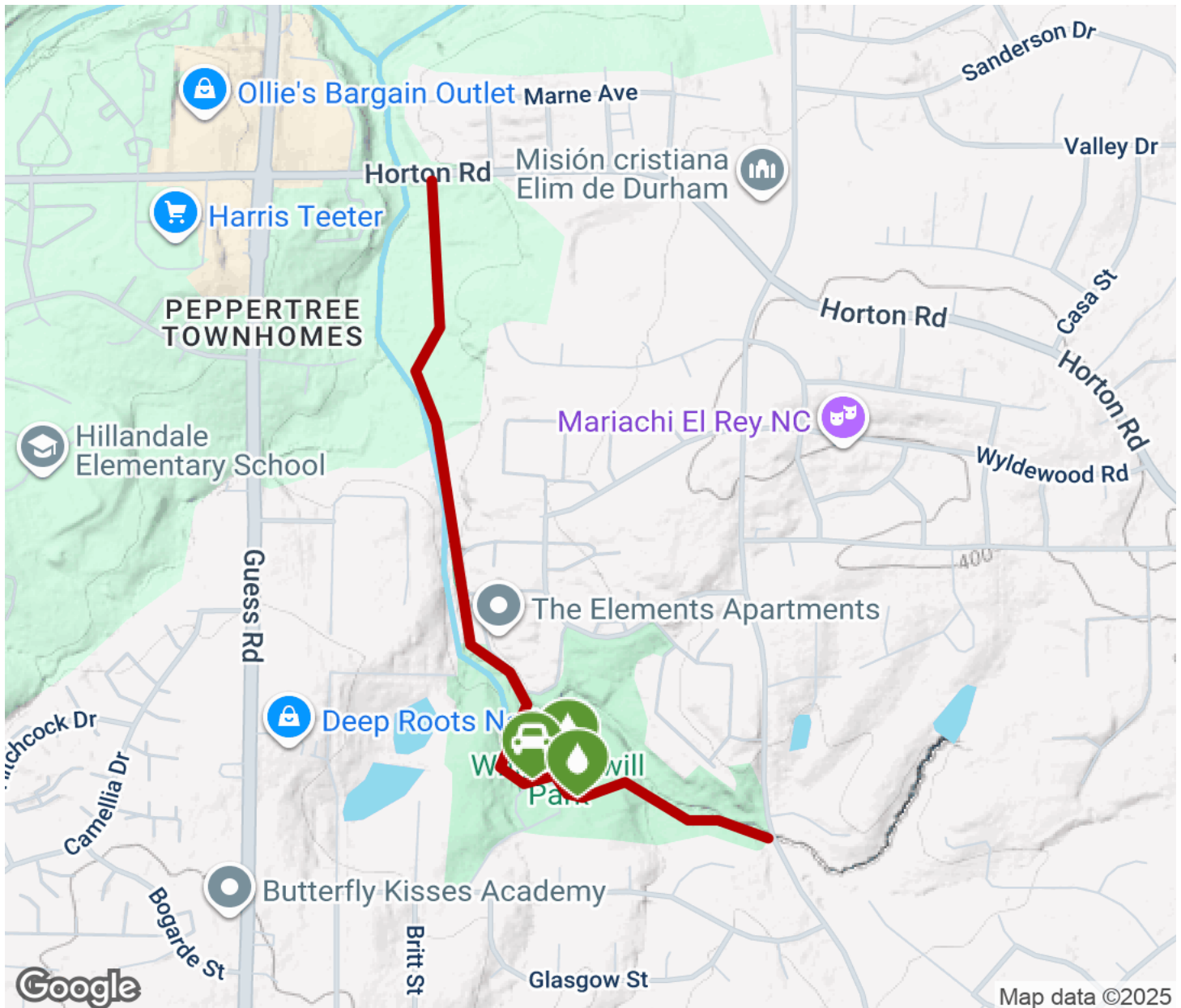
