The North-South Greenway is a complex of trails that link up to allow residents to cross the heart of the City of Durham without the need for a car. The South Ellerbee Creek picks up the southward journey where the [Ellerbe Creek Trail](#) ends, at the corner of West Club Boulevard and Washington Street. This segment of trail continues winding along the creek, crossing Knox Street into Pearl Mill Preserve, a protected natural area. The trail winds south and then east to end at Washington Street and West Trinity Avenue.

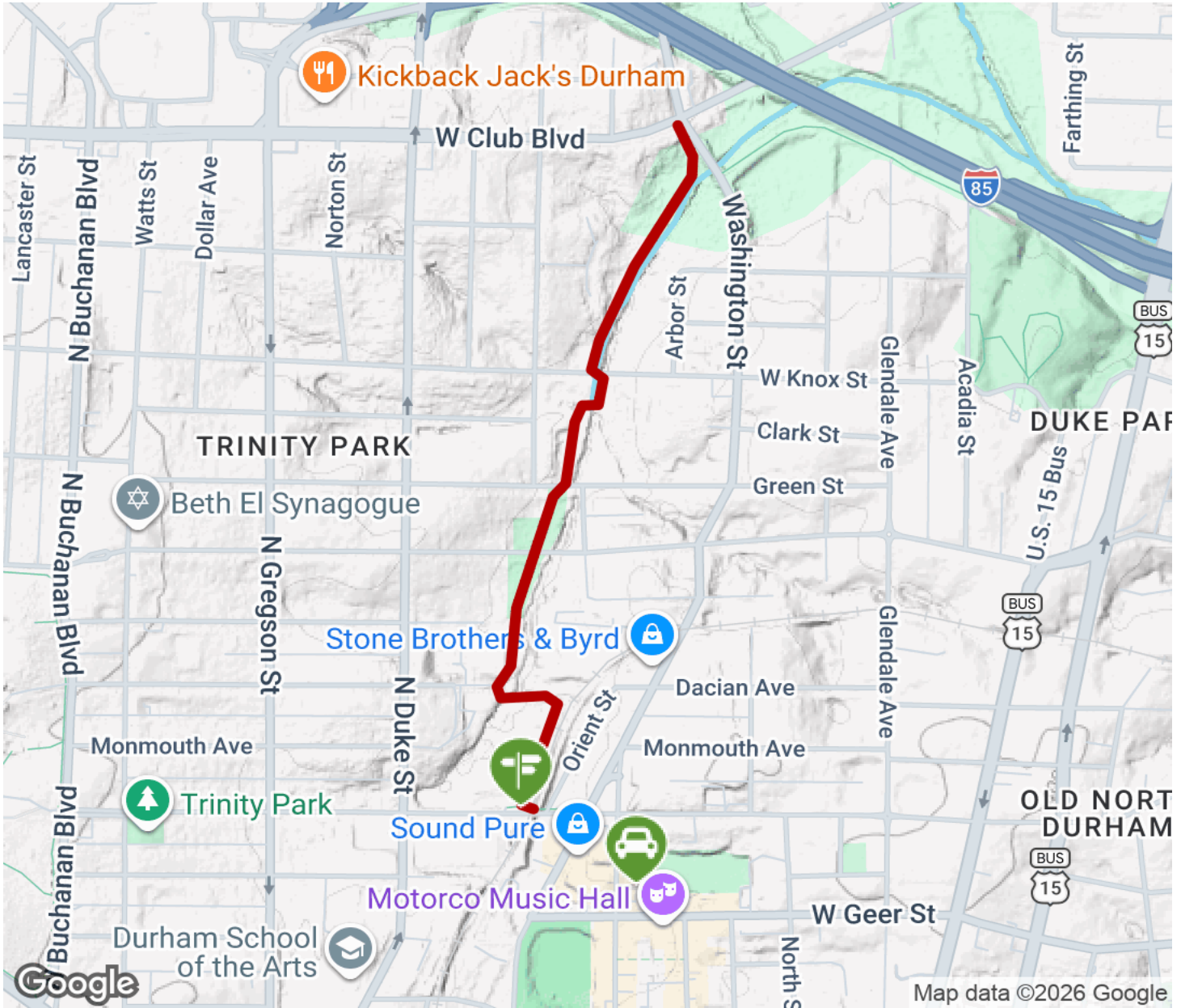
