Longview Lake Trail (MO)

Missouri



This multiuse trail invites lake visitors to walk, run or ride along Longview Lake. The reservoir was constructed by the Army Corps



This multiuse trail invites lake visitors to walk, run or ride along Longview Lake. The reservoir was constructed by the Army Corps of Engineers for the triple purposes of flood control, conservation and recreation. Longview Lake is popular for its ample activity offerings both on and off the water.

The trail traces the west shoreline of Longview Lake, beginning from Shelter 14 and winding south up to Shelter 9, providing access to all the shelters in between. It's a wide, flat trail surfaced with a crushed limestone aggregate that's easier on runners' joints than pavement (although there is concrete in parts). The trail is a good 6.5 miles from end-to-end, and at its south end provides access to Grandview's trails.
