With farmland to the east and the Des Plaines River Floodplain to the west, this picturesque trail is a relaxing adventure on two feet or on wheels. The crushed stone trail runs from Prairie Springs Park to Highway C/ Wilmot Road. If 1.8 miles isn't enough, visitors can continue on to the natural-surface Donald Hackbarth Trail by way of the shared-use pathway alongside Highway C, or add another 2.3 miles on the [paved trail](#) that circles Lake Andrea in Prairie Springs Park.

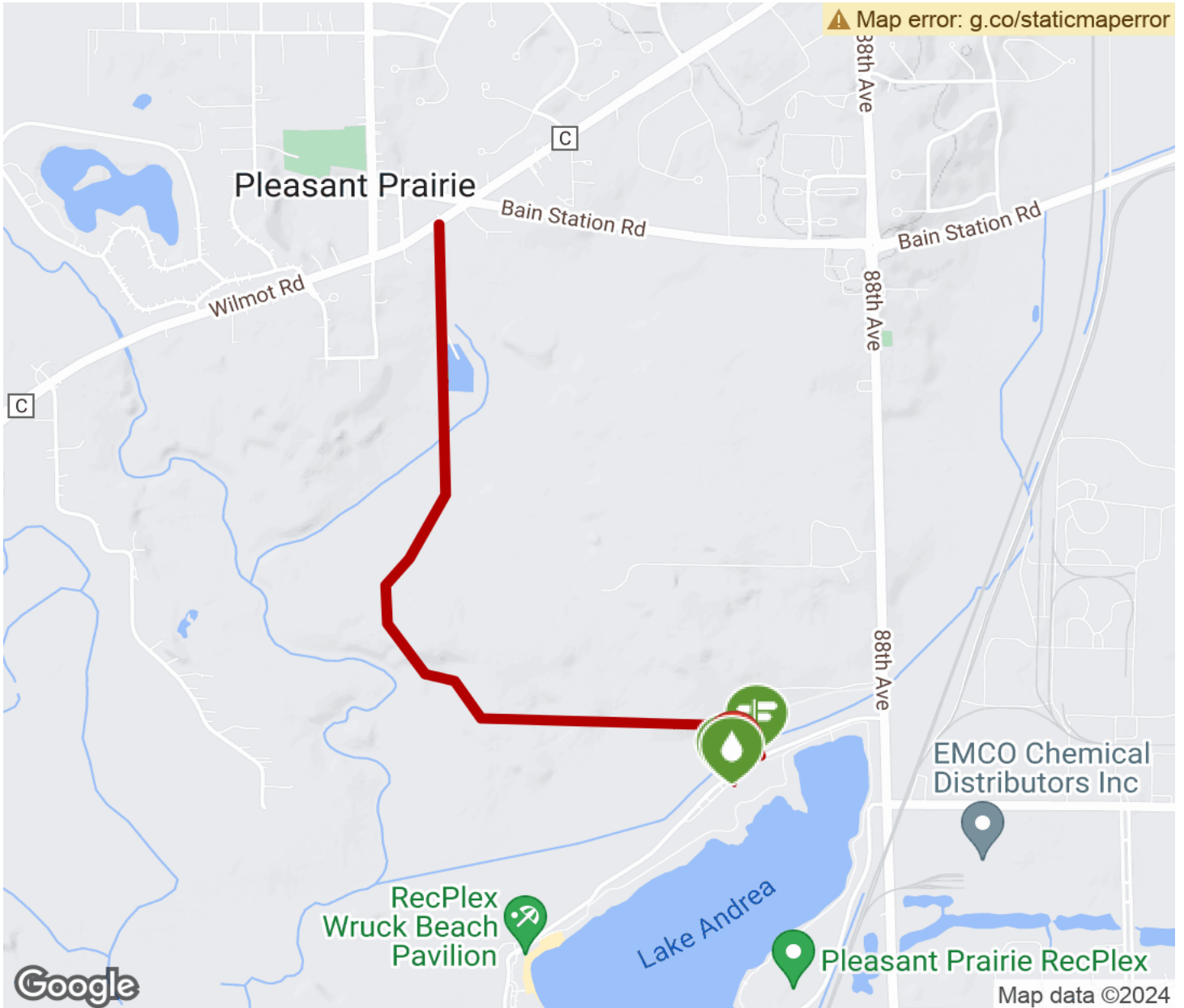
## Parking & Trail Access
