The crushed stone trail runs from Prairie Springs Park to Highway C/ Wilmot Road. If 1.8 miles isn't enough, visitors can continue on to the natural-surface Donald Hackbarth Trail by way of the shared-use pathway alongside Highway C, or add another 2.3 miles on the the <u>paved trail</u> that circles Lake Andrea in Prairie Springs Park.


Parking & Trail Access
