FEVR Trail *Nebraska*

The FEVR Trail (Fremont Elkhorn Valley Rail-to-Trail Project) borrows its name from the Fremont Valley & Elkhorn



miles of trail between Highway 77 in Fremont and the former Rail depot and cuts through the prairie and grassland between these two Nebraska towns.

The FEVR Trail (Fremont Elkhorn Valley Rail-to-Trail Project) borrows its name from the Fremont Valley & Elkhorn excursion line, that ran trains on 17 miles between Fremont and Hooper.

The southern section of the trail is a 1-mile concrete route, located on the west side of Fremont and anchored by residential subdivisions at both ends, making it easily accessible to neighbors. The north end of the trail is Palmer Drive in the Washington Heights neighborhood. From there the trail stretches to Somer's Avenue, where it crosses railroad tracks and continues to 23rd Street. Then the trail is a straight-shot down to Linden Avenue, paralleling BNSF train tracks.

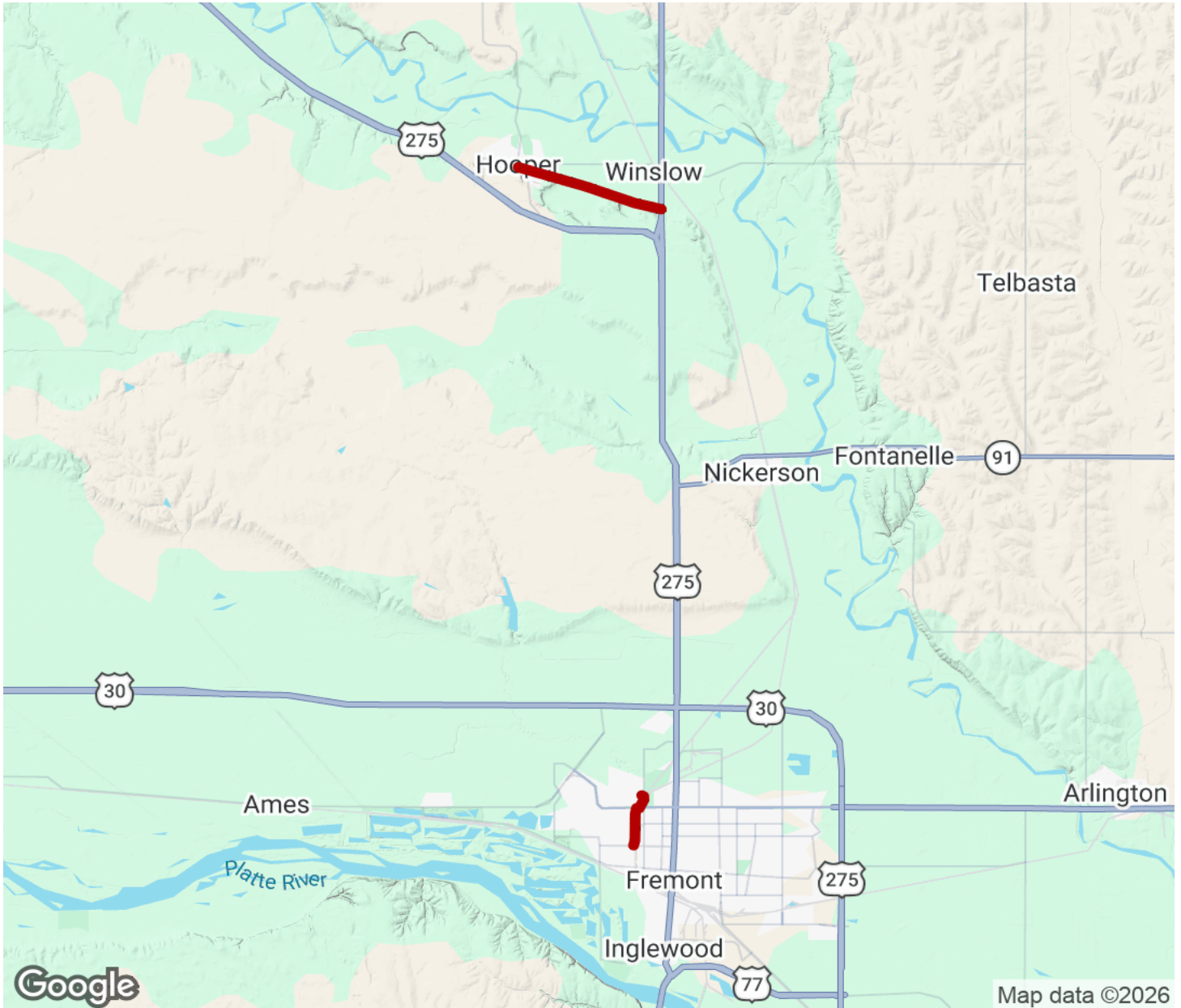
Parking & Trail Access
