Antiquity Greenway is a half-mile segment of the Town of Cornelius' growing collection of multiuse paths and is part of the



Antiquity Greenway is a half-mile segment of the Town of Cornelius' growing collection of multiuse paths and is part of the trail loop called the [Emerald Necklace](#).

The paved trail begins on Zion Drive in downtown Cornelius and winds its way northeast towards the South Prong Rocky River Greenway in neighboring Davidson. It branches at the end, with one branch emerging at 930 South Street and the other continuing to meet the [South Prong Rocky River Greenway](#), passing underneath the Bridge to Antiquity, a historic red covered bridge.

Antiquity Greenway is open to walkers, joggers, cyclists and other non-motorized users.

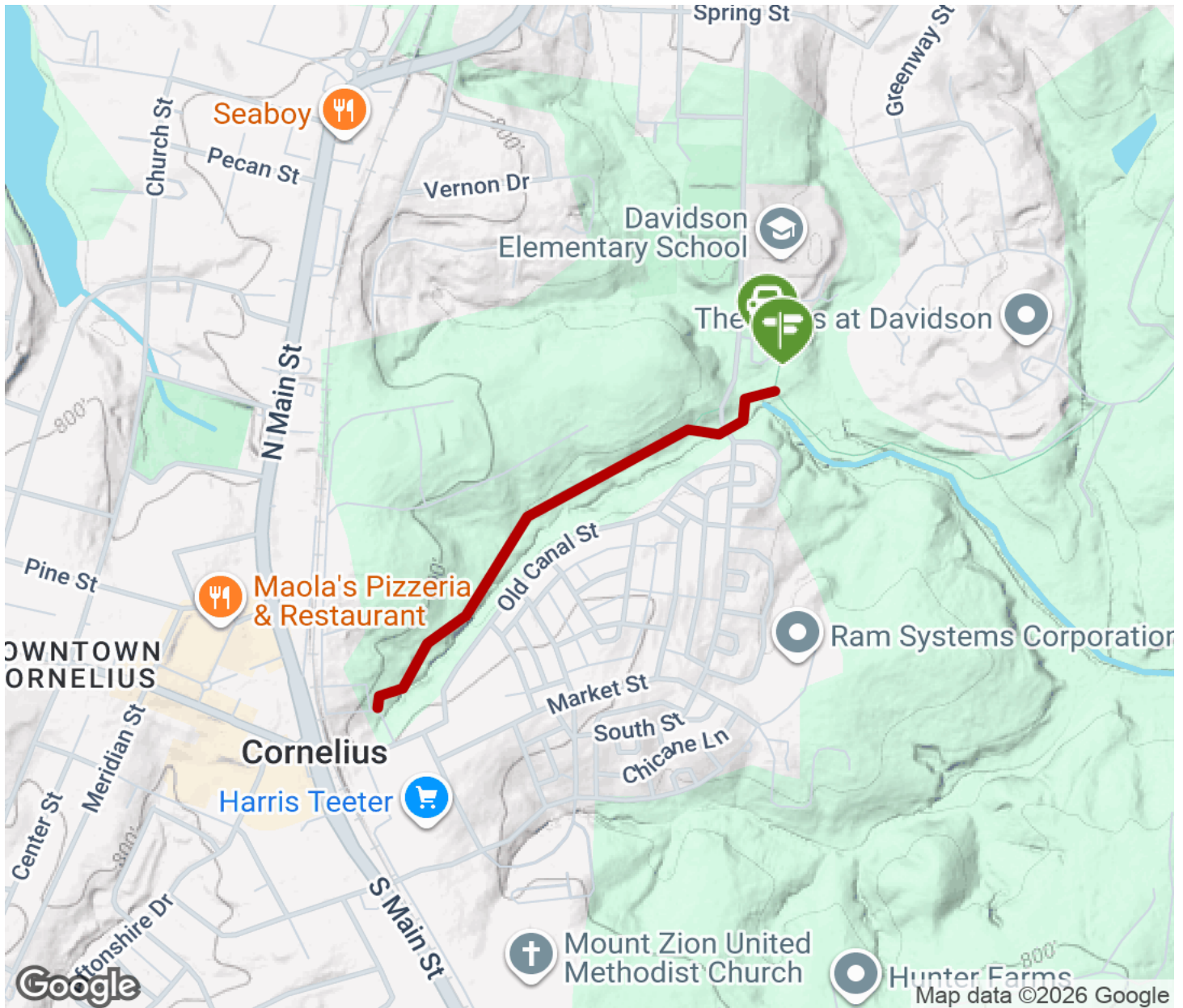
Parking & Trail Access
