Nickel Plate Trail (Indianapolis-Fishers-Noblesville)

Built on the former Norfolk Southern railbed, the Nickel Plate Trail will stretch from Indianapolis through Fisher to Noblesville. The



The Fishers section of the trail continues south from 146th almost to 96th Street, where in the future, a pedestrian bridge will provide a connection to the Indianapolis trail. There is a crossing with a warning signal at 141st street and a tunnel under 116th Street that allows trail-users to avoid waiting at the intersection. Enjoy the Blazing the Trail mural by artist, Becky Hochhalter. The mural features local landmarks and there 15 butterflies hidden within the scene—see how many you can spot. Leave the trail to explore the historic Nickel Plate District where you can grab a bite to eat, shop, and more.

Another section of trail runs between 96th and 82nd Sts, although currently the trail is interrupted while a pedestrian bridge is constructed over 96th St. The southernmost section of trail runs between 75th St. and then along 42nd St. until it connects to the [Monon Trail](#).

Built on the former Norfolk Southern railbed, the Nickel Plate Trail will stretch from Indianapolis through Fisher to Noblesville.

The trail runs between Pleasant Street in Noblesville and the Monon Trail in Indianapolis, with a few gaps in between. Benches, pet waste stations, trash bins, and informational signage will continue to be added along the route in Fisher, as well as additional trail connections.

The Noblesville portion of the continuous trail runs south from Pleasant Street to 146th Street, where it seamlessly connects to the Fishers' section. There are two former railroad bridges converted into pedestrian bridges, as well as benches and trash bins located along the Noblesville portion of the route.

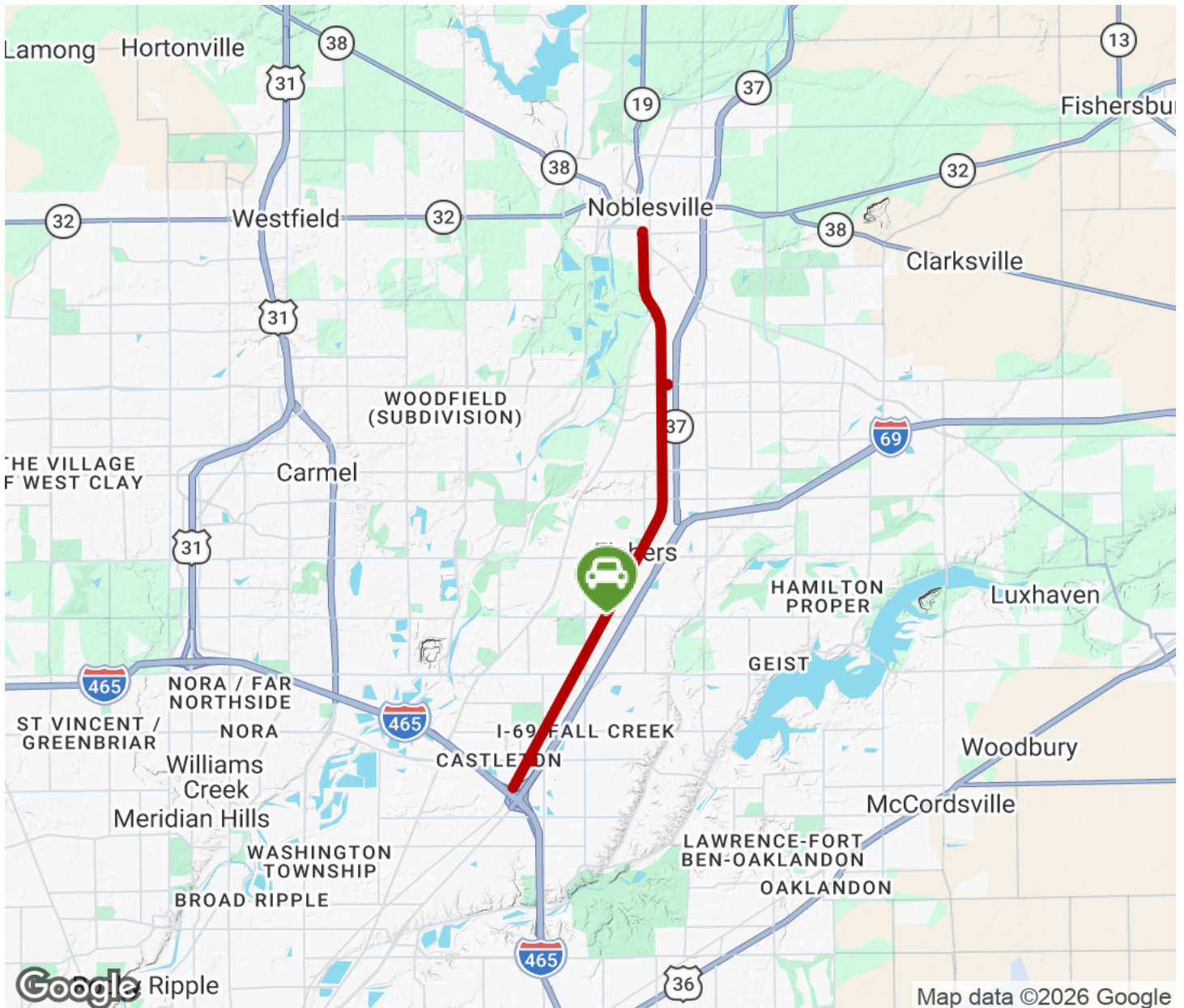
