Hartsville Bicycle Path

South Carolina

To increase the level of safety for those bicycling, the City of Hartsville developed the bike paths that form this route. Beginning



with sports facilities, an indoor rec center, picnic sites, and a 1.2 mile walking trail.

To increase the level of safety for those bicycling, the City of Hartsville developed the bike paths that form this route. Beginning by the intersection of Sunset Dr and W Carolina Ave, the route forms a large loop through the city center before circling back towards Dunlap Dr in the west of the city. The route includes paved bike paths, segments on sidewalks, and sections marked on the street.

The route's W Carolina Ave portion passes by Kalmia Gardens, a 35-acre public botanical garden and historic house that includes walking trails and boardwalks. On S Sixth, the path passes Pride Park, which has a picnic shelter, a playground, restrooms and an outdoor stage that is used for events. While traversing W Washington St, the bike path passes by the City of Hartsville Dog Park and Byerly Park, a 93-acre multi-use recreational park

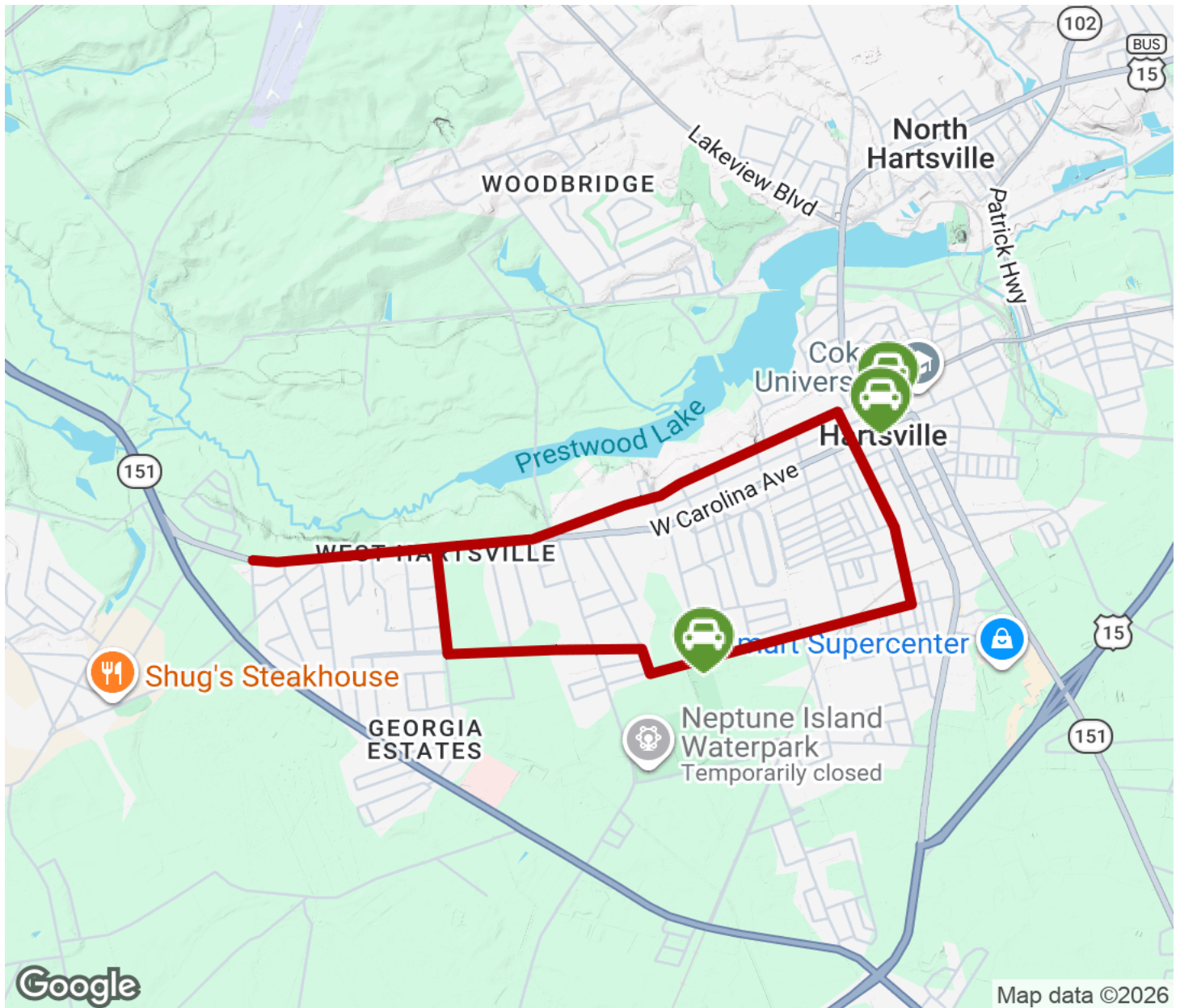
Parking & Trail Access
