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## **DWP Trail** Minnesota



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With stunning views of the St. Louis River as it curves around its adjoining lakes to meet the ocean, the DWP Trail offers a pleasant experience on a gentle, meandering path through the woods to the city of Duluth. The trail follows a former rail corridor previously used by the Duluth, Winnipeg, and Pacific (DWP) railroad. The route includes a tunnel under Elys Peak and two steel trestles, which now serve as pedestrian bridges. There are gates and signs with wayfinding maps at the trail's access points. The trail connects with another rail-trail, the Munger State Trail, to create a loop.

With its primarily gravel surface and gentle grading, the trail is available for walking, running, biking, crosscountry skiing, horseback riding, and snowshoeing. This 10-foot-wide multi-use trail is ADA-compliant, making it



accessible for those using mobility aids.
