

Fort Kearney Hike & Bike Trail Nebraska



The Fort Kearny Hike-Bike Trail extends 1.8 miles between Fort Kearny State Recreation Area and the Bassway Strip Wildlife



The Fort Kearny Hike-Bike Trail extends 1.8 miles between Fort Kearny State Recreation Area and the Bassway Strip Wildlife Management Area, where it connects to the <u>Kearney Hike and Bike Trail</u>. Following a former corridor of the Burlington and Missouri River Railroad, the trail crosses both channels of the Platte River and the pedestrian bridges make the perfect place at dawn and dusk to view the Sandhill Cranes during their spring migration.

While on the trail, take thew opportunity to enjoy the flora and fauna of the Platte Valley. In winter, the trail is popular with cross-country skiers. Horseback riding, fishing, swimming, boating and camping are available at the Fort Kearny State Recreation Area.


