Perrin's Path South Carolina



Named in honor of Perrin Lawson, Jr., a local outdoor enthusiast and public servant who passed away in 2001, Perrin's Path is a short



route along the entire coast.

Named in honor of Perrin Lawson, Jr., a local outdoor enthusiast and public servant who passed away in 2001, Perrin's Path is a short but important trail, forming a key link in the city of Myrtle Beach's off-road transportation network.

The trail is a continuation of the <u>Grissom Parkway Trail</u>, which picks up at 48th Avenue, although Perrin's Path offers a more shady, tree-lined route, with the trail gaining some separation from the nearby parkway to offer a more scenic experience. On the northern end, the trail links to the <u>Colonel Robert Bell Path</u>, which winds further north into the adjoining subdevelopments. In additional to it's role in the local trail network, Perrin's Path also forms a short leg of the massive East Coast Greenway project, which aims to provide a complete biking and walking
