Built along the former Bay Colony Railroad line, the Medfield Rail Trail stretches between Ice House Road in the Town of Medfield to



Built along the former Bay Colony Railroad line, the Medfield Rail Trail stretches between Ice House Road in the Town of Medfield to the town's border with Dover. Running primarily through woods, the 1.3-mile trail crosses the North Brook and is open for walking, running, biking, horseback riding, and cross-country skiing. Generally 10-feet-wide, the trail is flat and smooth with a surface of reclaimed asphalt topped by a layer of stone dust. Dogs on leashes are welcome.

The trail is part of a trail system called the Bay Colony Rail Trail. The [Needham Rail Trail](#) and the [Upper Falls Greenway](#) are also part of the Bay Colony Rail Trail.


Parking & Trail Access
