Originally a grist mill and farm, Liberty Park is Salt Lake City's oldest city park and offers numerous recreational opportunities.



Originally a grist mill and farm, Liberty Park is Salt Lake City's oldest city park and offers numerous recreational opportunities.

The park has 2 playgrounds (Rotary Playground has ADA access), volleyball courts, bocce ball courts, a basketball court, horseshoes, grills, a pavilion, a gazebo, a greenhouse, an aviary, a museum, a swimming pool, several water features, multiple shopping and concessions options, an afterschool program, drinking fountains, and restrooms. The park's pond has an island with the gazebo and paddleboats are available. Explore the park's treasures via its concrete pathways and its running/walking trail.

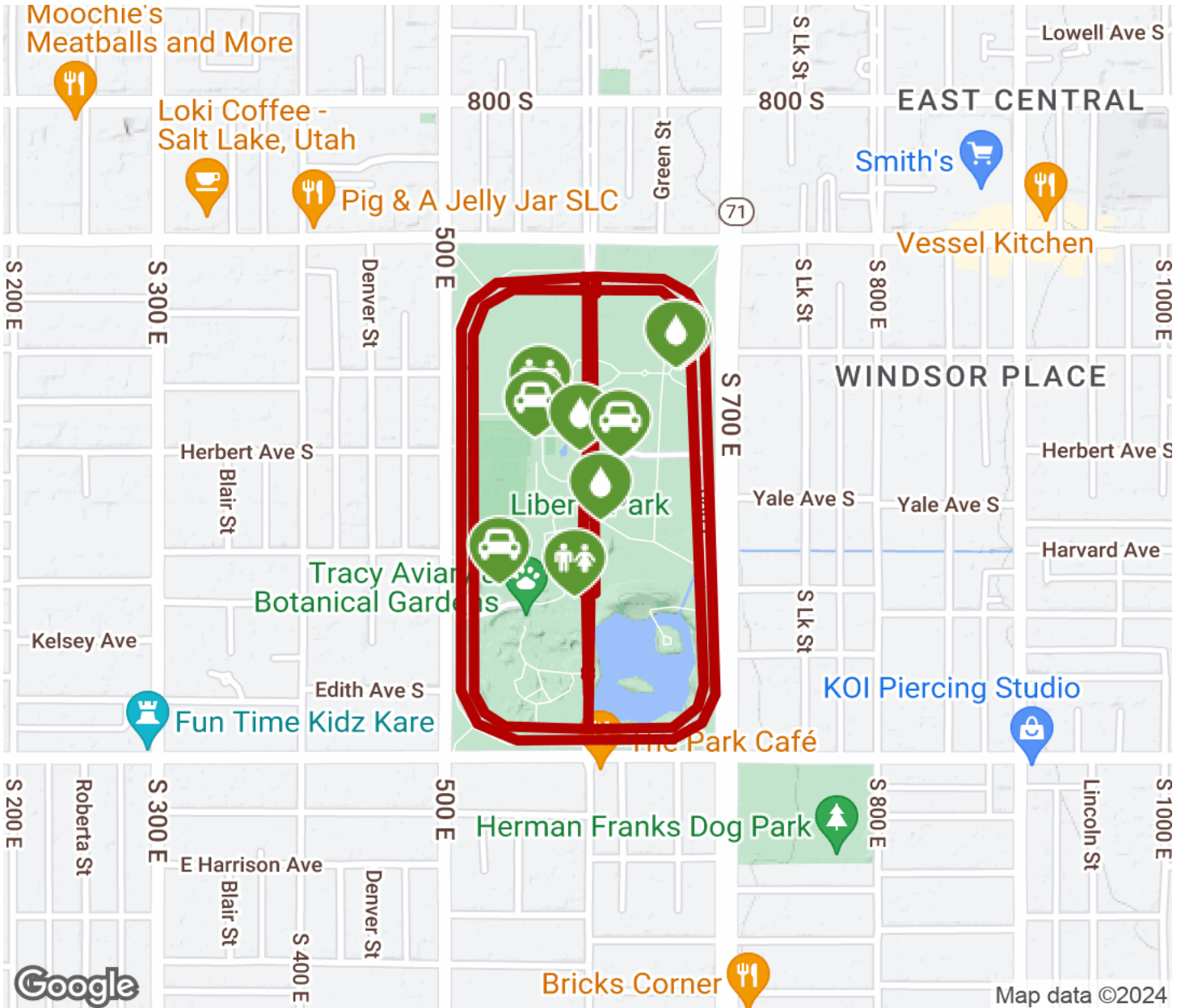
