Kronberg Park Multi-Use Trail

Oregon

Winding through a nature park, this multiuse trail provides a vital link between SE McLoughlin Boulevard and the Kellogg Creek Bike-



concrete path provides an alternate route for a brief portion of the trail and offers an outlook with views of the water.

Connecting to the southern end of the 340-foot-long Kellogg Creek Bike-Pedestrian Bridge, the trail ends. Continue across the bridge to Southeast Main Street and downtown Milwaukie. Cross Main Street to access the MAX Orange Line's Milwaukie/Main Street station. Dogwood Park (11299 SE Main St) is just north of the end of the bridge and has picnic tables, as well as a small parking. There are trees and lighting along the trail route.

In addition to providing a scenic route for recreation, the Kronberg Park Multi-Use Trail serves as an essential transportation link for the surrounding communities, providing a safe and efficient route for cyclists and pedestrians to access local businesses, schools, and other amenities.

Winding through a nature park, this multiuse trail provides a vital link between SE McLoughlin Boulevard and the Kellogg Creek Bike-Pedestrian Bridge in downtown Milwaukie.

At its southern end by the intersection of Southeast McLoughlin Boulevard and Southeast River Road, the pathway connects to the [Trolley Trail](#), which runs 6-miles north-south through Milwaukie's Island Station neighborhood.

Meandering north through the nature park, there is a 60-foot elevated walkway with a smooth concrete surface, railings, and a scenic outlook. The route becomes a paved asphalt trail as it curves towards the bridge. A short

Parking is available at Dogwood Park (11299 SE Main St).



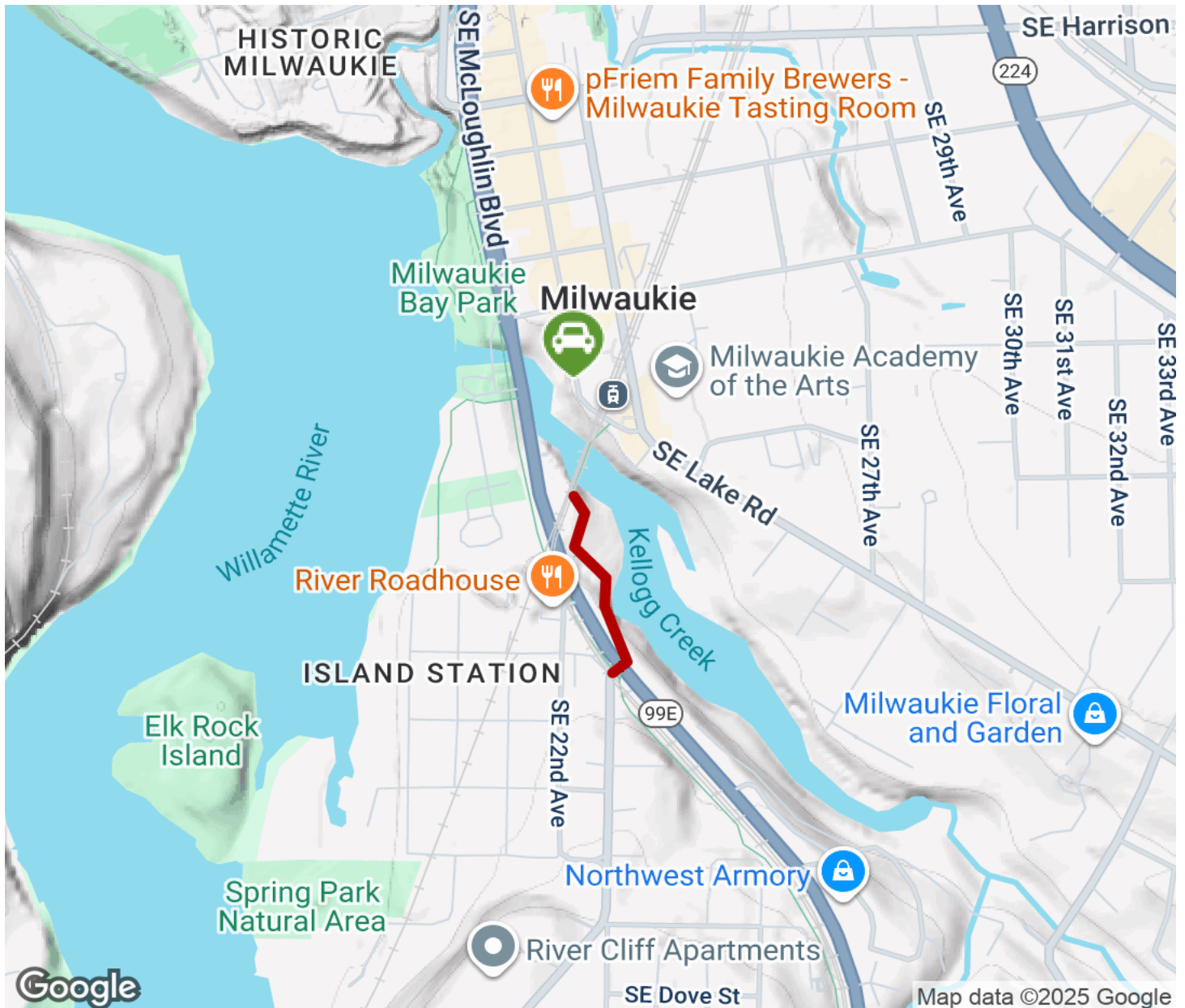
