Most notably, at its eastern endpoint, the trail connects to the [River Platte Trail](#), a nearly 30-mile trail spanning throughout most of Colorado and the surrounding suburbs.

The trail itself can be used as a starting point for access to the [River Platte Trail](#) or also to give trail users access to the Northwest Greenbelt off-leash Dog Park.

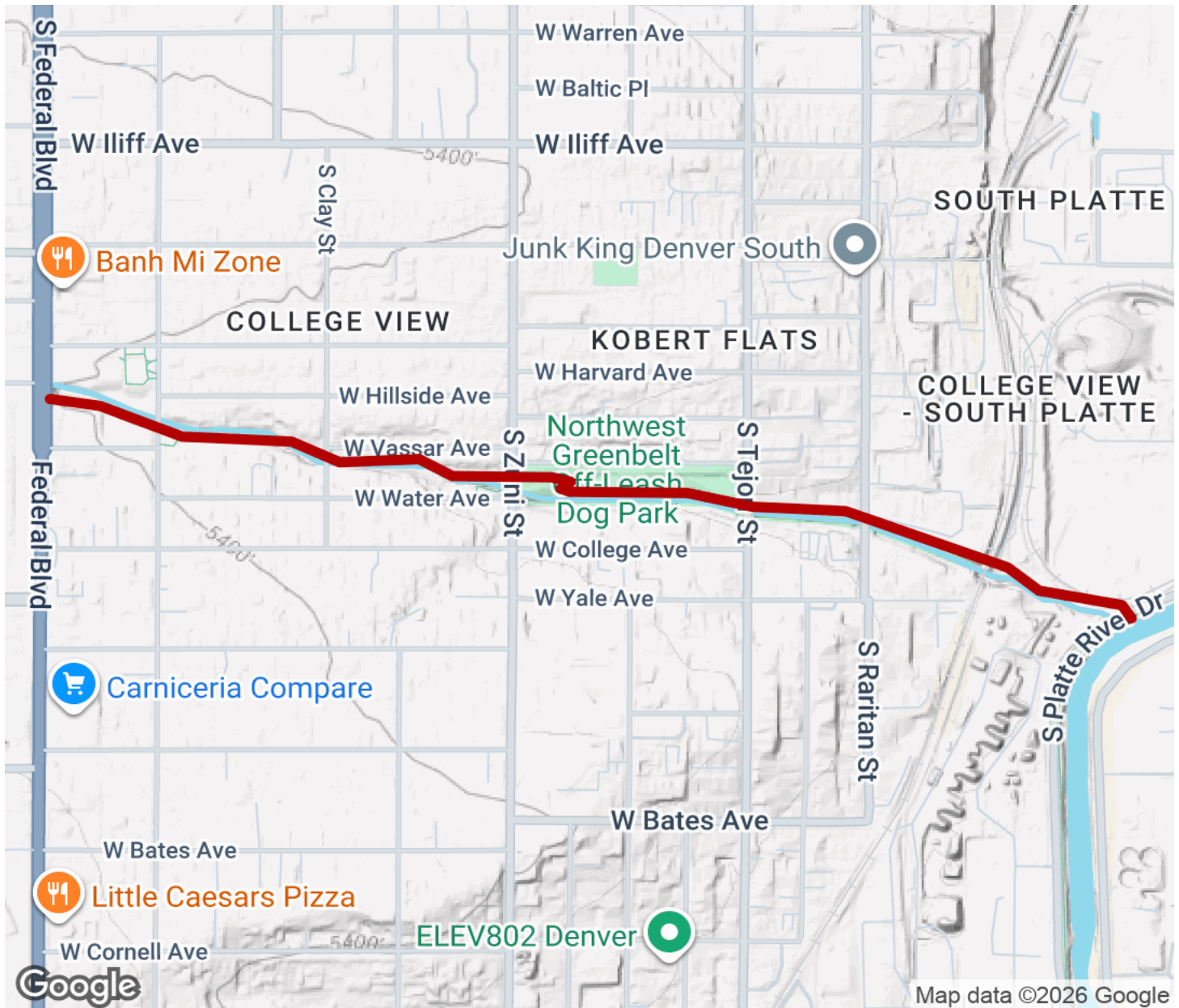
