Lock Haven Levee Trail Pennsylvania



The Lock Haven Levee Trail, also known as the William Clinger Riverwalk or the Lock Haven River Walk, is a 2.5-mile paved



Enjoy the natural splendor of the Pennsylvania Wilds including the gorgeous views of the Susquehanna River.

The Lock Haven Levee Trail, also known as the William Clinger Riverwalk or the Lock Haven River Walk, is a 2.5-mile paved pathway that runs along the levee separating the West Branch Susquehanna River and Lock Haven, an officially designated Susquehanna Greenway River Town.

The trail meanders along the river between Lock Haven University and Memorial Park, which is across from the Piper Memorial Airport at the trail's eastern end. The park has picnic benches, bike racks, and parking.

There are benches placed at intervals along the well-lit trail, which passes the J. Doyle Corman Amphitheater and Floating Stage. During the summer, the town's concert series can even be watched right from the trail or front row from a boat on the Susquehanna River.
