

McKenzie Trail California



The McKenzie Trail is a paved 1.5-mile rail-trail in Fresno, CA. The accessible trail has a paved concrete surface with a painted line

About the Route

The McKenzie Trail runs parallel to E McKenzie Avenue and E Washington Avenue through quiet, residential neighborhoods east of downtown Fresno.

From its western end at the intersection of N Willow Avenue & E McKenzie Avenue, the trail heads east past residences, several fields, a few churches and a middle school. Short trail spurs provide connections to the surrounding neighborhoods. The route is sheltered by trees and has lamp posts. There are several road
