

About the Route

The Governor Mario M. Cuomo Bridge Path is separated from the auto traffic by glass and mesh barriers. The entire trail provides sweeping, scenic views of the Hudson River and below-boat traffic.

Connections

At the western end of the trail, trail users can connect to both the <u>Raymond G. Esposito Trail</u> and the <u>Old Erie Path</u>.
