Eastern Regional Greenway

This five-mile, out-and-back greenway trail is part of a major water/sewer infrastructure project in Gwinnett County alongside

Note: There is no northern access so trail users must ride out-and-back from the southern trailhead.

About the Route

The single trailhead off Harbins Road features parking, bathrooms, water, a bike repair station, and a picnic pavilion. The trail passes under 316 and intersects only one dead-end road near James Shackleford Park, creating an stress-free, relaxing trail experience for people biking, walking, running and rolling. While there are some sunny parts, much of the trail is shaded by oaks, tulip poplars
