The trail is not only a rail trail, but connects to public transit at either end, the K and A Lines respectively. The trail is flat and paved, and cuts through a mostly industrial corridor in South LA.

There is no designated parking for the Rail to Rail Path, but as the name suggests, there is public transit acces on either end of the trail.



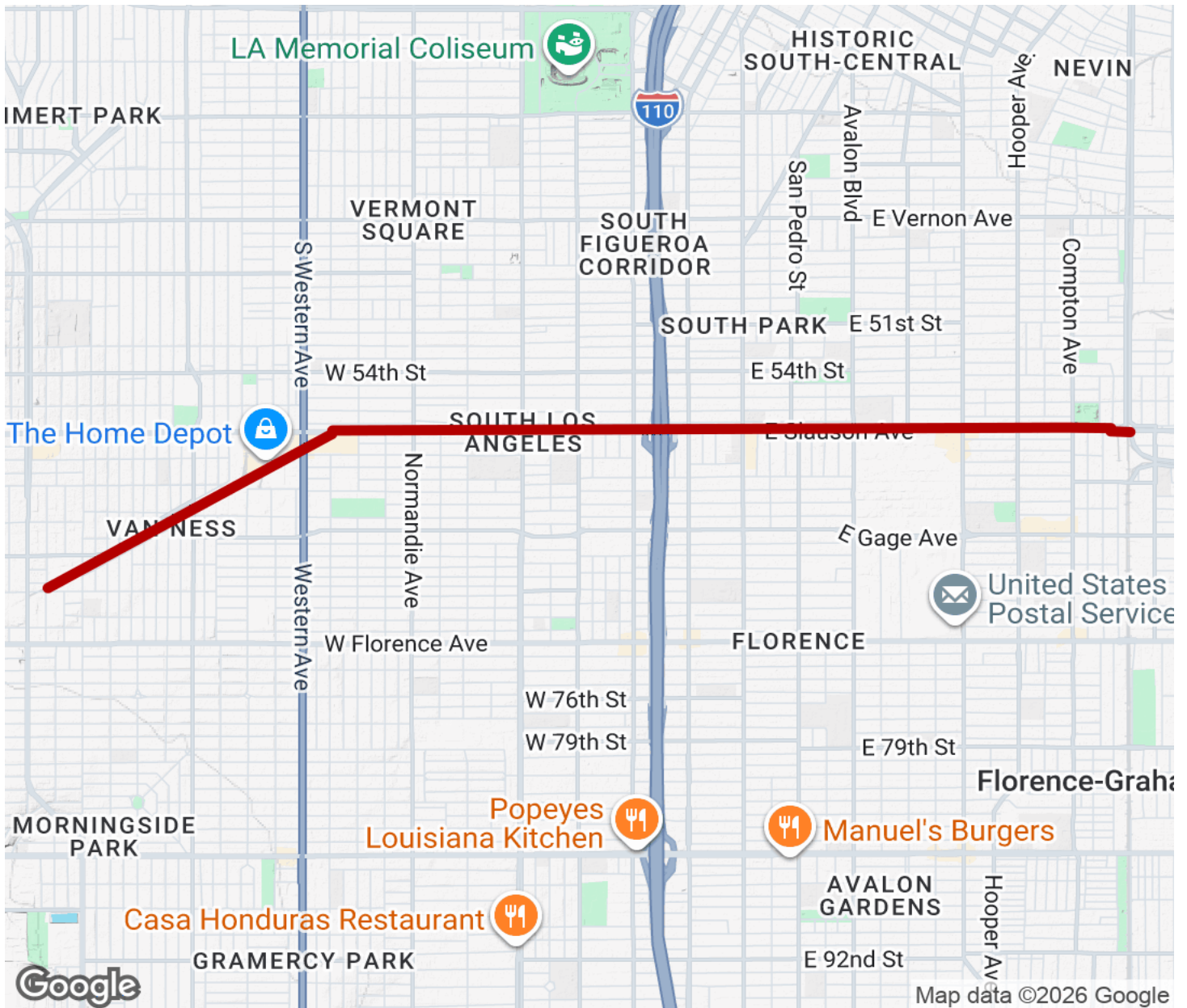
