Harriman Trail

Idaho

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The Harriman Trail is an 18-mile trail that runs through Blaine County, Idaho. The route was named after W. Averell Harriman, a prominent politician and businessman who originally deeded the land to the state of Idaho.

The trail is comprised of dirt, and largely follows ID-75 between Ketchum and Galena Lodge. The result is an easy-to-access trail with wonderful scenic views surrounding the trail. The route is groomed for cross-country skiing in the winter. The route also intersects Wood River Campground.
