The 7.5-mile Whittier Greenway Trail occupies part of an abandoned railroad right-of-way in its namesake town, running parallel to Whittier Boulevard and Lambert Road between Pioneer Boulevard near I-605 and the LA County/Orange County border. An active rail line travels from Mills Avenue to the LA County/Orange County border.

#### About the Route

Along this urban, and sometimes noisy, trail, trail users will be able to spot some interesting wind vane sculptures, along with nice landscaping with native California plants. As a bonus to riding the train, take a short detour to the nearby Whittier Uptown Historic District, a great place to catch a snack, coffee, or even a meal from a wide range of
