

Cady Way Trail Florida



The Cady Way Trail is a 7.5 mile paved, multi-use pathway that runs between Orlando's Coytown neighborhood and the Goldenrod



The Cady Way Trail is a 7.5 mile paved, multi-use pathway that runs between Orlando's Coytown neighborhood and the Goldenrod area of nearby Winter Park, where it connects to the <u>Cross Seminole Trail</u>. Popular among cyclists and pedestrians alike, the trail links neighborhoods with nearby shopping and business districts, as well as several parks and recreational facilities.

About the Route

The Cady Way Trail's western endpoint is at Lake Druid Park, at 899 Coy Drive (Orlando). Adjacent to Lake Druid, the park is home to mountain biking paths, a dog park and a community garden. Heading east from the park, the trail follows Seabee St before turning south to follow

Warehouse Road. After turning northeast on Maguire Blvd, the trail runs adjacent to the sprawling Fashion Square shopping mall, home to numerous shops, restaurants, big box stores and a cinema. The paved path remains street-side until it crosses to the east of Bennett Road, where it enters a wooded thicket surrounding Lake Gear.

The trail continues to traverse neighborhoods on its own right-of-way, eventually curving due north adjacent to Truman Road. The trail continues north for 2 miles, largely tucked away behind tree cover as it passed behind suburban homes until it reaches the Cady Way trailhead, adjacent to a large recreational complex with a pool, tennis courts, and more. From here, the trail curves northeast, and crosses Semoran Blvd on an exclusive-use arched bridge. Continuing east, the trail enters more commercial surrounds, and maintains its same direction, making only gentle curves for 1.9 miles. The trail passes Perch Lake and the Orlando Magic Recreation Center shortly before reaching its eastern endpoint.

The Cady Way Trail's eastern endpoint is at the intersection of Aloma Avenue and Howell Branch Road/Hall Road (Winter Park). From here, trail users can connect to the <u>Cross Seminole Trail</u>, which offers 29 additional trail miles, by crossing to the northern side of Aloma Ave.

Connections

At the its eastern endpoint, the Cady Way Trail connects to the <u>Cross Seminole Trail</u>. At Baldwin Park St, a connection is available to the <u>Lake Baldwin Trail</u>.

Trail History

The Cady Way Trail follows the former passenger rail corridor of the Orlando and Winter Park Railway, built beginning in 1889. The line ran between Orlando and Winter Park, and later Olviedo, and was known popularly as "The
