Be sure to stop at Joseph Katelman Water Park in Sunset Park for a dip in the pool, or bring a tennis racket or baseball glove and make use of the recreational facilities at Sunset Park.

Running north along Indian Creek from busy US 275, the Indian Creek Trail extends for more than 3 miles —where it meets the [Veterans Memorial Trail](#) and [Lake Manawa Trail](#)—to the southwestern edge of Sunset Park on 16th Avenue. The trail uses a tunnel to avoid a dangerous crossing of Interstate 29/80. Along this portion of the trail, the scenery is a mix of residences, industrial properties and scenic views of tiny Indian Creek. At the southern end of the trail near

Another section of the Indian Creek Trail travels north from Sunset Park to the active railroad tracks behind the houses on 14th Avenue, while a third segment cuts diagonally southeast from Sunset Park through residential neighborhoods on an abandoned Wabash Railroad corridor.

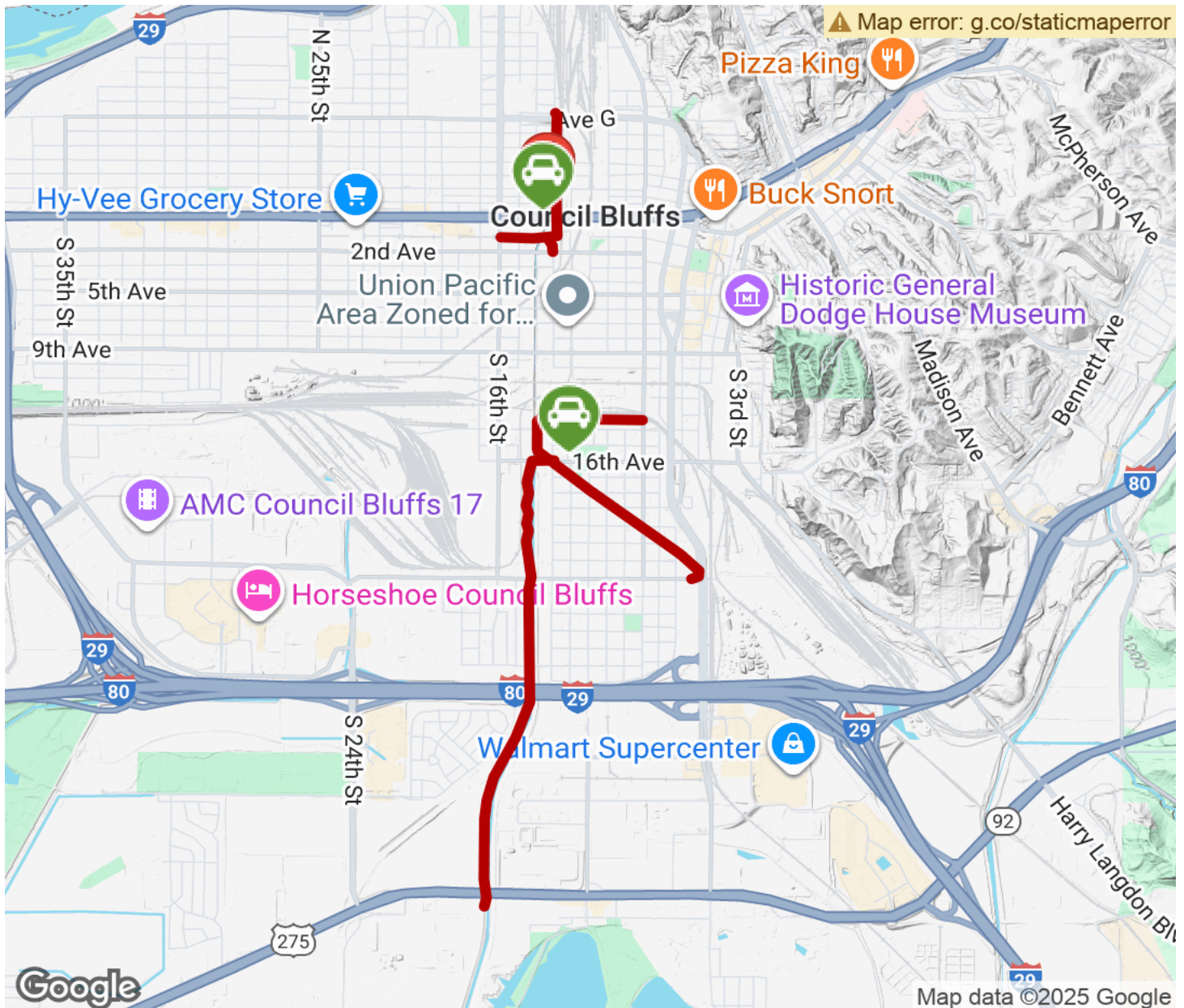
